ANNUAL REPORT 2019-2020

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Post Graduate Government College for Girls, Sector 42, a premier multi-faculty institution of Higher Education in the City Beautiful, Chandigarh, was established in 1982. Spread over a spacious campus of nearly 18 acres in the southern part of Chandigarh, the college has emerged as an all-encompassing institute. It imparts education to more than 4000 students in the streams of Commerce, Humanities, Science and Computer Applications. bouquet of 58 courses offered by the college comprises of Doctorate Programme in Zoology, Master's Degree Programmes in 09 subjects, PG Diploma Programmes in 06 subjects, Bachelor's Degree Programmes in 13 subjects and Honours Programmes in 18 subjects (Commerce/ Humanities/ Science).

The students can also avail 11 Career/Job Oriented Add-on Courses for a dual degree on graduating. Varied Courses available are- Animation and Graphics; Bioinformatics; Cosmetology; Disaster Management; Environmental Auditing; Entrepreneurship; Event Management; Mass Communication and Video Production; Music (Vocal and Instrumental); Tourism and Travel Management; Web Designing and Multi Media. 181 subject combinations in Humanities, 11 in Science and honours in 14 different Arts and commerce subject can be opted by a students. The students can also avail 11 Career/Job Oriented Add-on Courses and thus they gain dual degree on graduating. These Add-on courses include Bioinformatics, Environmental Auditing, Tourism and Travel Management, Event Management, Mass Communication, Video Production, Animation & Graphics, Web Designing & Multimedia, Entrepreneurship and Disaster Management and Music (Vocal and Instrumental). The college has made a niche for itself in the northern region because of its infrastructure, multi-talented faculty and array of courses offered. Embellished with well-maintained 9 gardens, vast playgrounds, 100 mbps lease line, an exclusive Information Technology Block with cutting edge facilities; a well-equipped fully air-conditioned library with a compendium of more than 41,000 books and journals, equipped with INFLIBNET, RIFD, browsing facility, gymnasium, Wi-Fi hostel facility with all modern amenities, stationery shop; food court and fruit & juice stall, State-of-The-Art auditorium 'SABRAS'

A team of 130 dedicated and well qualified faculty members under the able stewardship of Prof Binu Dogra, facilitate effectual teaching and contribute in shaping the genNext. The

college has 12 Professors, 50 Associate Professors and 68 Assistant Professors which include 66 Ph.D. and 26 M.Phil degree holders. Our college boasts of having maximum number of Professors amongst all the colleges of the city. With the emphasis on consistent enhancement of skills and research, the faculty has published more than 400 research papers and 110 books (with ISBN). Till date, faculty members of distinct departments have completed 07 Major, 24 Minor and 02 Consultancy Projects sponsored by various agencies. At present, 54 research scholars are pursuing Ph.D under the able guidance of the faculty. 27 faculty members representing 50 departments are members of the Board of Studies and another 04 are added members of different faculties of Panjab University, Chandigarh. One of the faculty is a member of Senate and another one is member of Academic Council, Panjab University, Chandigarh. 08 of our faculty members are actively involved in framing curriculum and creating learning resources for other government Institutes/Universities.

The college has a State-of- the-Art infrastructure comprising of 23 smart class rooms, 39 laboratories, Air Conditioned Library with a compendium of 42,000 books, Gymnasium equipped with latest facilities, Auditorium "Sabras", Research Lab in Life Sciences, Pro active Placement cell, Day Care Centre, Gardens and Sports amenities. The college campus is fully wi-fi and under e-surveillance. To impart holistic training, the college undertakes extension activities through eight units of N.S.S., one unit of NCC (Army Wing), twelve societies and departmental activities. Various societies such as Aids Awareness, Best Out of Waste, Commerce Society, Community Hygiene and Sanitation, Cultural and Heritage, Drug De-Addiction , Environment, Gender Equity and Women Empowerment, Literary, Olympism, Science and Traffic Awareness Society that aids the students to sensitize about major personal, social and health issues. The college magazine "SHIKHAR", the college newsletter, 'Scoop' and the departmental activities all provide the students a platform to hone their potential and capabilities. The college Career Counselling and Placement Cell, Anti-Ragging Committee, Entrepreneurship Development Cell, Anti-Stress Helpline, and Anti-sexual Harassment committee function in tandem with various departments to facilitate students.

Excellence in terms of academics, sports, extra-curricular and infrastructure has been possible due to the constant endeavour of the Chandigarh Administration, RUSA, MHRD, DST, PU and UGC in providing us with State of the Art infrastructure, funding and other appropriate facilities.

The Project Approval Board (PAB) of Rashtriya Uchchar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) of MHRD, Govt. of India has approved a grant of Rs. 2 Crore under Infrastructure Head to our college out of which 1 crore has been utilized for the upgradation of infrastructure like hostel mess, washrooms, conference room, daycare centre, research lab and computer lab. 50 lakhs are devoted exclusively for making the IT block disabled- friendly. A preparatory grant of Rs 2 lakhs was also received for organizing capacity building workshops for students, teaching and non-teaching staff.

About 117 non-teaching members provide assistance in the smooth functioning of the college.

The college academic results have been outstanding this year too. Many of our students have acquired university positions in various streams.

SUPPORT SYSTEM

The University Grants Commission, New Delhi, Panjab University, Chandigarh and Dept. of Education, Chandigarh Administration is our major support systems. In addition, our college administrative department, examination branch, hostel, library and placement cell work in close confluence and ensure smooth running of the college.

ADMINISTRATIVE BLOCK

We have a fully automated office which has dedicated and committed administrative staff led by Mrs. Santosh. The services of the Administrative staff are an integral and indispensable part of the functioning of the college and a fully computerized office has made the working of the Administrative Branch better organized and more efficient.

EXAMINATION BRANCH

The college examination branch is a confidential section with the responsibility of smooth conduct of Mid-Semester exams, University Examinations and competitive Exams for all the UG & PG courses on the basis of which internal assessment is calculated and Annual Prize Distribution is held. 4 Examination centers are allotted for Semester Exams. Also various competitive examinations of National and State repute are assigned to the college by the Chandigarh Administration from time to time. Some of the important entrance examinations worth mentioning here are Civil Services, NDA, PCS, HCS, CET, BSRB, RRB, IB, SLIET, MES, and UGC etc

Our college is amongst the first few colleges which has adopted PU Examination Appointment Project Online.

It is pertinent to state that College Examination Branch is equipped with BIZHUB-German make Printing Machine for printing of confidential papers etc. which helps to save Govt. funds to the extent of 40%. Revenue from other sources such as disposal of used answer sheets is generated from time to time for improving exam infrastructure.

HOSTEL

265 students were admitted to the hostel in the session 2019-20. The hostel - 'a home away from home' brings together students from different parts of the country bringing about an intermingling of cultures. At present, there are students from 12 states namely J&K, H.P, Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, Delhi, Uttranchal, Leh, Ladakh, UP, Bihar, Kerala and Manipur. 40 students are accommodated in the Government Hostel, Sector -24, Chandigarh. The college provides adequate facilities for the recreation of the hostlers -TV room with DVD, a small Library, study room, in-door games, sick- room and a cyber room; computers, internet, Wi-Fi & non-conventional energy resources like solar geysers and Solar Lights. Three competitions were held in the hostel: Rangoli competition on the occasion of Janam Ashtami; Rakhi Making; posters and card making contest on Teachers Day. In an effort to upgrade the facilities, the hostel mess, dining hall, kitchen, washrooms and passages are being renovated.

LIBRARY

The college library is fully automated and caters to the academic and educational needs of the students and the staff. During the current session, more than 1,000 books have been added to the existing stock. In addition to this, the library subscribes to 71 magazines, 14 subject journals and 17 newspapers in Hindi, English and Punjabi to keep the students and staff abreast with current affairs at home and abroad. INFLIBNET is available in the library to access E-Books & Journals. Web OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) facility is available in the library using which the staff and students can search for the books through various approaches like author, title, accession number, publisher, subject, or a combination of these. The library has two Corners –a Digital Corner for Rare Books (50 Books) and Braille Corner for visually challenged students and has also procured JAWS Software. In this session, the library has taken the membership of National Digital Library of India (NDLI) which will be beneficial for the staff & students. Reference Books are also issued to students for 2 days. Internet and Photostat Facility is also available in the Library for students.

RUSA

The Ministry of Human Resource Development released the third and last installment of Rs 50 lacs under Rashtriya Uchchar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) for development of infrastructure in our college. The college has utilized the said amount on installation of lift in IT block, purchase of 2 online UPS for computers labs, RFID in the library and furnishing of mini conference room.

The college has a placement cell to cater to Campus Placements. Professionals from various fields interact with the students regarding job opportunities and train them in preparing profiles, appearing in interviews and participating in group discussions. Despite the threatening atmosphere of recession, a number of companies like IBM Daksh, IBM GLOBAL and HCL visited our college during the placement drive and offered placements to students of graduating classes from B.A., B.Sc. & B.Com. This year a joint job fair was held where all the city government colleges collectively invited around 15 companies and the interviews were held at P.G.G.C.-46, Chandigarh. wherein students from our college also appeared. The college placement team has been working with the other five teams of the city Govt. Colleges; under the leadership of Director, Higher Education, Chandigarh Administration. We have a CCYC (College Career Youth Club), wherein around 150 students enrolled as members to utilize the

services offered by the Placement Cell. Following is the list of students who got selected during the placement drive.

LABORATORIES

The college has as many as twenty eight laboratories in the subjects of Botany, Chemistry, Physics, Zoology, Bio-Technology, Microbiology, Computer Science, B.C.A., Communicative English, Communicative Hindi, Geography, Psychology, Fine Arts, Dance, Music-Vocal and Instrumental and Home Science. These labs are equipped with all relevant items as required per University conditions. During current session new lab in the subject of Bioinformatics is being constructed after the approval of the Urban Planning, Department of the Chandigarh Administration. The Bio Informatics Lab with 15 smart classrooms is near completion.

NCC Activity list 2019-20

The college has **one NCC Unit i.e. Army Wing**. The session commenced with the admission of 48 new cadets in the year 2019-20, raising the strength to 121. **Mrs. Amrit Kaur** is the **Care Taker** of this unit. **Cadet Sujata of 3rd year was honoured by “Senior under Officer” Rank**. In ATC 2019 she got 2nd prize in solo song, first prize in Drill and gold medal as a Best Firer .In ATC 2020 she was a camp senior and **was honoured by “Best Cadet Award”** .She begged gold medal as camp senior and also received Gold medal in volleyball, Silver medal in firing, browns and silver medal in Singing and Silver medal in drill.

Cadet Priyanjali Deol of B.A 2nd year attended AITSC National Camp held at Delhi after clearing 3 levels (TSC 1, 2, 3and 4).Their directorate was placed at 1ST position, out of 17 directorates. **She bagged 4th all India position as the Best Cadet**. She was the **only cadet from CHANDIGARH GIRLS BATTALION who was recommended for Youth Exchange Programme at AITSC 2019-20.
