COLLEGE PROFILE

Nestled in a sprawling campus of approximately 18 acres in the southern part of the 'City Beautiful', the college has, indeed, matured from a sapling into a mighty oak. From a modest beginning in 1982 with 300 students and 14 faculty members, today, the college has emerged as an all-encompassing multi-faculty institute with student strength of 4082. The college offers 50 courses (UG and PG) with 329 subject combinations in Arts, 13 in Science, Honours in 13 Arts/commerce subjects & Post Graduations in 14 subjects. The college also offers Dual degree in the form of graduation with an added option of 9 Add- on Courses. Academic flexibility for vertical movement is available within the programs in some specified courses like English, Public Administration, Sociology, Political Science, Information Technology, Zoology, Botany, Microbial Biotechnology and Commerce. Four self-financing programmes i.e. BCA, M.Sc. (IT), PGDCA and M.Sc. (Microbial-Biotechnology) are also offered by the college.

Our college has also become the first city govt. college to be approved as a research center in the subject of Zoology by Panjab University Chandigarh. A testimony of our excellence in term of our excellence in academics, sports, extra - curricular and infrastructure is the whole hearted appreciation that we have earned from the NAAC peer team. It gives me immense pleasure to share with you all the momentous achievement of the session 2015-16. Our college has scored grade A with CGPA 3.21 in the National Accreditation and Assessment Council visit. We have also qualified for Potential for Excellence scheme of the Govt. of India.

All this has been possible due to the constant endeavour of the Chandigarh Administration in providing us with the State of the Art infrastructure, funding and other appropriate facilities. The credit also goes to the dedication of highly qualified 144 faculty members with 69 Ph.Ds and 37 M.Phils, who facilitate effectual teaching and inculcate multifaceted development of the students. Committed to research and innovation, the faculty has published more than 349 research papers and 60 books. At present 15 Research Scholars are pursuing Ph.D. under the supervision of our erudite faculty and 5 of their students have already been awarded Ph.D. degrees. Two faculty members are senators, one has been elected unopposed to the Academic council while 27 of the faculty are members of the Board of Studies of Panjab Univ. Another 7 are added members of different faculties of PU, Chandigarh & one is of University of Rajasthan, Jaipur and ISS University, Mansarovar, Jaipur.

About 90 non-teaching members provide assistance in the smooth functioning of the college. It gives me immense pleasure presenting before you all, the highlights of the activities and accomplishments of the institution during 2014-15.

Maintaining the tradition of excelling in academics, this year too our academic achievements have been outstanding. Students especially from Postgraduate classes and Science classes have shown commendable results. SUPPORT SYSTEM

The University Grants Commission, New Delhi; Panjab University, Chandigarh and Dept. of Higher Education, Chandigarh Administration are our major support systems.

In addition, our college Administrative Branch, Examination Branch, Hostel and Library work in close confluence and ensure smooth running of the college.

A testimony of our excellence in academics, sports, extra - curricular and infrastructure is the whole hearted appreciation that we have earned from the NAAC peer team. It is a momentous achievement of the session 2015-16. Our college has scored **grade A** with **CGPA 3.21** in the National Accreditation and Assessment Council. We have also qualified for **Potential for Excellence** scheme of the Govt. of India.

The NAAC Peer Team had visited the college from 15-17 October, 2015, headed by Prof .Manimala Das, Former Vice – Chancellor, Netaji Subhas Open University, Kolkata, Dr. V. Sujatha, Cauvery College for Women, Tamil Nadu and Prof Margaret CH. Zama, Mizoram University, Mizoram. The Peer Team was impressed and commended the excellent infrastructure, consistently good academic record, strong & motivated leadership and & varied extra-curricular activities in its Peer Team Report.

All this has been possible due to the constant endeavour of the MHRD, Chandigarh Administration and Panjab University in providing us with the State of the Art infrastructure, funding and other appropriate facilities.

The credit also goes to the dedication of highly qualified 144 faculty members with **69 Ph.Ds** and **37 M.Phils**, who facilitate effectual teaching and inculcate multifaceted development of the students.

Committed to research and innovation, the faculty has published more than **349 research papers and 60 books**. At present 15 Research Scholars are pursuing Ph.D. under the supervision of our erudite faculty and 5 of their students have already been awarded Ph.D. degrees. Two of our faculty members, **Mrs Shubhpreet and Mrs Parvinder** Kaur have been elevated as Principals in Govt. colleges of Punjab. Two faculty members **Dr RPS Josh and Dr Dalip** are senators, **33** of the faculty are members of the Board of Studies of Panjab Univ., one has been elected unopposed to the Academic council. Another **7** are added members of different faculties of PU, Chandigarh & one is of external member of studies, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur and ISS University, Mansarovar, Jaipur.

Prof Gunbir kaur and Prof Urvashi Raul has been elevated as Professors, taking the total number of professors in the college to 7. About 115 non-teaching members provide assistance in the smooth functioning of the college. **Dr Nemi Chand** has the distinction of receiving **State NSS Award for Best NSS Programme officer** by Chandigarh Administration and **Youth Work leader award** by Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports.

Another feather in our cap is that PGGCG-42 is the only affiliated college of the Panjab University which is selected by DST under “Fund of Improvement of S&T Infrastructure” (FIST) Scheme of the DST this scheme for support in **level-0** category.

The Department of Science & Technology, Government of India has provided financial support to the amount of **Rs. Seventy Lacs** to the College. The college will receive **Rs 32 Lacs** for improvement of teaching facilities, **Rs. 20 Lacs** for Research facilities, **Rs 7 Lacs** for networking and computational facilities, **Rs 3 Lacs** for Books and journals, **Rs 5 Lacs** for the establishment of E-learning room and **Rs 3 Lacs** for maintenance. This is the first ever grant sanctioned by DST to the college

UGC RESOURCE CELL

- Under COP (Career Oriented Programme) scheme, the college has received a financial assistance of **Rs 13.6 lac** as Seed Money from the UGC, New Delhi for **Cosmetology and Animation Graphics**. The received grant would be utilized for the purchase of books & Journals, equipments, augmentation of laboratory facilities, payment of remuneration for a period of 5 years.
- UGC had earlier sanctioned Career Oriented Courses in the subject of Event Management, Tourism, Bioinformatics, Environment Auditing, Disaster Management and Entrepreneurship which are the maximum number of courses sanctioned by UGC to any of the city Govt. College. Under the RUSA scheme of Govt. of India, a detailed IDP has also been submitted to start a finishing school on the campus

The college has been keeping pace with the changing and growing demand for infrastructural up gradation.

ADMINISTRATIVE BLOCK

We have a fully automated office which has dedicated and committed administrative staff led by Mrs. Kawaljit Kaur and Mr. A.K. Kaushal. The services of the Administrative staff are an integral and indispensable part of the functioning of the college and a fully computerized office has made the working of the Administrative Branch better organized and more efficient.

EXAMINATION BRANCH

The college examination branch carries out various assignments to conduct House Examinations, University Examinations and competitive Exams. College Examination Branch conducts September and December House Exams for annual classes & mid - semester Exams for Semester undergraduate & postgraduate classes on the basis of which internal assessment is calculated and Annual Prize Distribution are held. 4 Examination centres are allotted for Semester Exams & 2 centres to conduct Annual Exams. Also various competitive examinations of National and State repute are assigned to the college by the Chandigarh Administration from time to time. Some of the important entrance examinations worth mentioning here are Civil Services, NDA, PCS, HCS, CET, BSRB, RRB, IB, SLIET, MES, and UGC etc.

Our College Examination branch has played an important role in Online Exam system and submitted PG & UG internal assessment through VPN for the first time with utmost efficiency, secrecy and zero-error tolerance.

It is pertinent to state that College Examination Branch is equipped with BIZHUB-German make Printing Machine for printing of confidential papers etc. and Examination Branch members take extra pain to do this job which helps to save Govt. funds to the extent of 40%. It is equipped with quality photocopier. Revenue from other sources such as disposal of used answer sheets is generated from time to time for improving examination infrastructure.

With the initiative of Registrar Examination branch, list of topper students class-wise & subject-wise has been prepared to guide and motivate intelligent students. College Examination work has been successfully web-interfaced with PU-VPN for handling editing, deleting, querying, viewing and printing reports which has substantially reduced paper work. Instead of using conventional examination form, the college has updated online examination - form submission in semester system. Communication gateway mechanism has been efficiently introduced for online submission of internal Assessment in undergraduate and post graduate classes. College has developed this software with the assistance of SPIC-MACAY (Chandigarh Administration), and the Examination relation data has been successfully exported to Ms. Excel format of Panjab University registration & scrutiny Branch. Online Examination cards were successfully downloaded for UG Classes this year.

HOSTEL

265 students were admitted to the hostel in the session 2015-16. The hostel - 'a home away from home' brings together students from different parts of the country bringing about an intermingling of cultures. At present, there are students from 12 states namely J&K, H.P, Punjab, Haryana, Delhi, Rajasthan, Uttranchal, Leh, Ladakh, UP, Bihar, Kerala, West Bengal And Tibet in the 16 wings of the college hostel. 33 students are accommodated in the Government Hostel, Sector -24, Chandigarh. 9 students were given accommodation in SCERT institute, sec 32, Chd. The college provides adequate facilities for the recreation of the hostlers -TV room with DVD, a small Library, study room, in-door games, sick- room and a meditation room; computers, internet & non-conventional energy resources like solar geysers and Solar Lights. In this session the hostellers were also provided with wi-fi facility. The common room was equipped with an almirah for storing items like speakers; mikes etc. notice boards were provided in common room, sports room, study room, cyber café & dispensary for students to showcase their creativity. The mess was spruced up with new top tables & colourful paintings made by Ms Shubpreet, former HOD, dept of English. New study tables were added in rooms & in hostel library for the convenience of the students. A further enhancement was the fitting of PA system in the hostel with speakers on each floor. New mercury free apparatus was provided in the dispensary.

LIBRARY

The college library is fully automated and caters to the academic and educational needs of the students and the staff. During the current session more than 1,000 books have been added to the existing stock. In addition to this, the library subscribes to 46 magazines, 74 subject journals and 18 newspapers in Hindi, English and Punjabi to keep the students and staff abreast with current affairs in home and abroad. INFLIBNET facility to access E-Books & Journal and Web OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) facility is available in the library. The library has two Corner -1 Digital Corner for

Rare Books (50 Books) and Braille Corner for visually challenged Students and has procured JAWS Software. Reference Books are also issued to students for 2 days. Internet facility and Photostat Facility is available in the Library for students.

PLACEMENT CELL

Placement Cell caters to Campus Placements & prepares the students to be financially independent and self-sufficient after completing their course/degree in the college. Our aim is to reach out to each & every student of the college and ensure their participation in motivational talks & interactive sessions on Career Guidance and employability skills. Placement Cell provides information to the students on regular basis about vacancies in private & public sectors throughout the country advertised online and offline and facilitates them in job applications.

Multinational & national companies such as IBM, Concentrix, WIPRO, HDFC Standard Life Insurance, DLF Pramerica, Aircel, Genpact, Aviva Insurance, WNS Global Services have been visiting our college and conducting placement drives. During this session 31 students have been given offer letters by Concentrix Corporation Pvt Ltd, IBM Multinational Technology & Wipro Technologies with the average pay package of upto 2.76 lacs per annum.

Keeping with the need to fill the gap between the current educational potential of graduates & post graduates and the growing market demands, our focus is to equip our students with the employability skills so as to facilitate them in finding jobs as they leave the institute. In this regard, as many as 26 training sessions and 7 workshops were organised on CV writing, Interview Skills, Group Discussion, Reasoning & Analytical Ability, and General Awareness, Communication Skills and Govt. Job preparation, Civil services Orientation, UGC Net, 3 aptitude tests were also conducted under the sponsorship of NIIT, Bulls Eye & Career Launcher during this session in which 306 students participated.

We make available printed copies/handouts & reading material on employability skills & soft skills such as tips on interview preparation and Group discussion to the students. Copies of 'Weekly Employment News', editions of magazines such as Pratiyogita Darpan, India Today & Competition Success also remain available for the students in the department.

Computers with internet facility are already installed in the placement cell for the use of students. Students visit the department in their free period and make use of this facility in the room.

For Post Graduate students, we have been conducting UGC Net workshops to prepare them for the common paper in the entrance examination.

LABORATORIES

The college has thirty four laboratories in the subjects of Botany, Chemistry, Physics, Zoology, Bio-Technology, Microbiology, Bio-informatics, Computer Science, BCA, Functional English, Functional Hindi, Geography, Psychology, Fine Arts, Dance, Music Vocal and Instrumental, cosmetology and Home Science. These labs are equipped with all relevant items as per University norms.

FEE CONCESSIONS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

During the current session, About 46 students were given scholarships of 4,000 each amounting to 1 lakh 84 thousand rupees. . Half Tuition Fee Concession has been given to approximately 320 students. The college awarded Rs. 7000/- as the Amarjeet/Beena Memorial Scholarship for outstanding performance in House/University examinations. Besides this, Smt. Saroj Vasudeva Scholarship is awarded to poor brilliant students. Some poor brilliant students have also been helped from the donations collected from the staff. In this session Rs.37500/- were collected and disbursed.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Extracurricular activities are integral to holistic Education. Indubitably, such activities also hone “Soft Skills” of the students enabling them to chisel and promote social interaction, time management, public relations, community service along with skills specific to their career path and future job success. Realizing that in today’s competitive globalised world, future employers seek individuals with these increased skill levels, making these talented students more sought-after in the job market; we encourage students to marshal their skills by allowing them to participate in the extra-curricular activities. Our students have also excelled at the national level in the sports arena where in they have won 6 silver medals at the National level, besides winning various accolades at the inter-college and university level.

The session has been buzzing with activity. A number of activities viz., Talent Hunt Competitions, Inter College and Intra College Quiz, Debates, Declamations, Folk Song and Poetry Recitation Competitions were organized during the session. Many lectures, seminars, symposia and workshops were also held for the awareness of the students.

Our college students bagged 36 prizes including 9 first prizes, 10 second prizes, 9 third prizes, 4 individual prizes and 3 trophies in the Zonal Youth Festival; 3 First prizes and one 1st prizes in the Inter-Zonal Youth Festival.

The Gender Equity and Non Discrimination Society has been activity engaged in diverse activities ranging from Interaction sessions with experts on sensitive gender issues like Domestic Violence, Sexual harassment, gender justice. The weekly ritual of Youth Adalat is organized on every Friday with collaborative initiatives by a NGO "Sanjh Jagori". On the 1st February 2016, 220 girls enthusiastically participated in Smart Mob along with all girls Orchestra for the purpose of One Billion Rising-A Global Campaign to raise voice against the Violence against women. Using innovative methods which are created and conscious processes-our effort is to engage the students in a diverse set of activities including theatre, workshops movies followed by discussions group activities, initiating dialogues learning and building mutual understanding camaraderie. Women Cell is engaged guidance and support regarding various emotional in providing guidance, support and counseling personal and international issues.

The emerging need of present times necessitates girls to be aware, make informed choices and develop self-respect. This year Women Cell organized highly interactive, energetic and participatory activities to generate awareness and sensitize girls towards gender biased and discriminating society. The major focus has been on teamwork, cooperation and positive approach. The women cell in collaboration with an NGO Sanjh Jagori, Chandigarh facilitates Youth Adalat every Friday. This process is participatory and is an open forum to talk about issues and concerns paramount to young adolescent girls. The students of our college joined the global campaign 'One Billion Rising' to raise their voice against all forms of violence against women and children. 220 girls performed a flash mob at four different locations in the city with panache and exuberance.

YOUTH ADALAT

- *A forum Of the Students, For the Students and By the Students*
- Launched six years ago, held every Friday, Youth Adalat is now an integral part of the functioning of the Women Cell. It is a novel initiative which provides a platform to young girls to openly discuss and deliberate on shared experiences of the trials and tribulations of their everyday lives. It further empowers them to find solutions by discerning strategies within their socio- economic, socio-cultural locale.

- The whole process of conducting the Youth Adalat is formulated in a manner where the participation and involvement of the students inclusive. There is a jury comprising of three members (students) who listen to the deliberations and analyse the discussion and highlight strategies at the end of the session.
- The girls bring forward incidents / cases they or others have encountered; current happenings or social cultural practices which pressurize them. A wide range of issues are brought to the forum. They range from harassment on the streets, buses / scooters / abusive language / sexual harassment / sexual bullying on social media / stalking and rape, incidents of broken relationships to strained parent-children relationships and domestic violence. The dimensions and scope of the deliberations and the strategies discussed are progressive and sensitive. We can see them gradually move out of their subdued reticent moulds to talking in an uninhibited manner- relating to each other and networking. This then leads to group cohesiveness; empathizing and taking pro-active action to uphold their dignity and rights. The transformation and confidence building along with concrete information has helped them to approach appropriate authorities for redressal.
- The main challenge is to prod them to overcome inhibitions and bring the ‘private to the public domain’ – encouraging them to break the silence about the negative feminine stereotype connotations.
- The response and engagement of the students has been so overwhelming that we have been able to continue the process and sustain it. Ours is the only institution which has an open forum of this kind. The partnership with Sanjh Jagori (NGO) has been very meaningful and we have been able to take process forward with a gender justice approach.
- The very fact that this initiative has been sustained with the consistent presence and participation of students is an evidence of success.
