On International Zero Waste Day, PGGCG-42 Chandigarh has been honored with a state award for achieving Rank 1st in the College Category for outstanding work done under the mission Waste to Wealth (Single Use Plastic Waste and E-waste Management) during the period of 25th March 2022 to 31st December 2022. Ms. Sunita Kumari, Nodal Officer of Mission Waste to Wealth, has received the Green Hero Award for her extraordinary efforts in the field of Environment Conservation and Restoration. The Valedictory Event was organized by the 'SWARMANI Youth Welfare Association, Department of Education, Department of Environment, Chandigarh Administration, Chandigarh Pollution Control Committee, and Department of Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh Administration. 1. **TRAINING OF TRAINERS**

This Journey started with a Training session on the safe disposal of single-use plastic and e-waste where officials from the Municipal Corporation and Pollution Control Committee Chandigarh administration made us aware about the need for this kind of initiative and also how to approach them for any kind of assistance for this cause.

Invited resource persons sensitize the participants about the effects and safe disposal of solid waste. Mr. Rohit, founder of 'swarmani' asked for one nodal officer and two green ambassadors from each institute for this job to carry out various awareness activities.

2. **Constitution of Plastic Prohibition Committee (SUPP)**

'Single Use Plastic Prohibition Committee' has been constituted by the institution in the presence of Principal Prof. Nisha Aggarwal to carry out various awareness activities regarding waste management under the Waste to Wealth mission. workshops/seminars/awareness activities like Plogging, poster making, and slogan writing were planned to sensitize the community, college staff, and students about the impact of single-use plastic and e-waste and the right methods of its disposal. Society members were suggested for a separate set up of these hazardous waste like plastic, glass, and e-waste on the campus, and a written order was circulated against the use of this stuff on the campus with a warning notice by the college principal.

3. Separate Set Up / Disposal Site for E-Waste, Plastic waste, And Glass Waste

Color Coded bins have been placed on the college campus under the aegis of 'Mission Waste to Wealth'. It functions exclusively for collecting discarded E-waste, single-use plastic, and glass waste. Stakeholders support the initiative taken by the dept. of the environment to get rid of the menace of SUPP. Dr. Shweta Bali HOD, Dept. of BCA and an Environmentalist by passion, donated their old water tanks to use as disposal bins for the mission. So all started with a very eco-friendly approach from stakeholders.
