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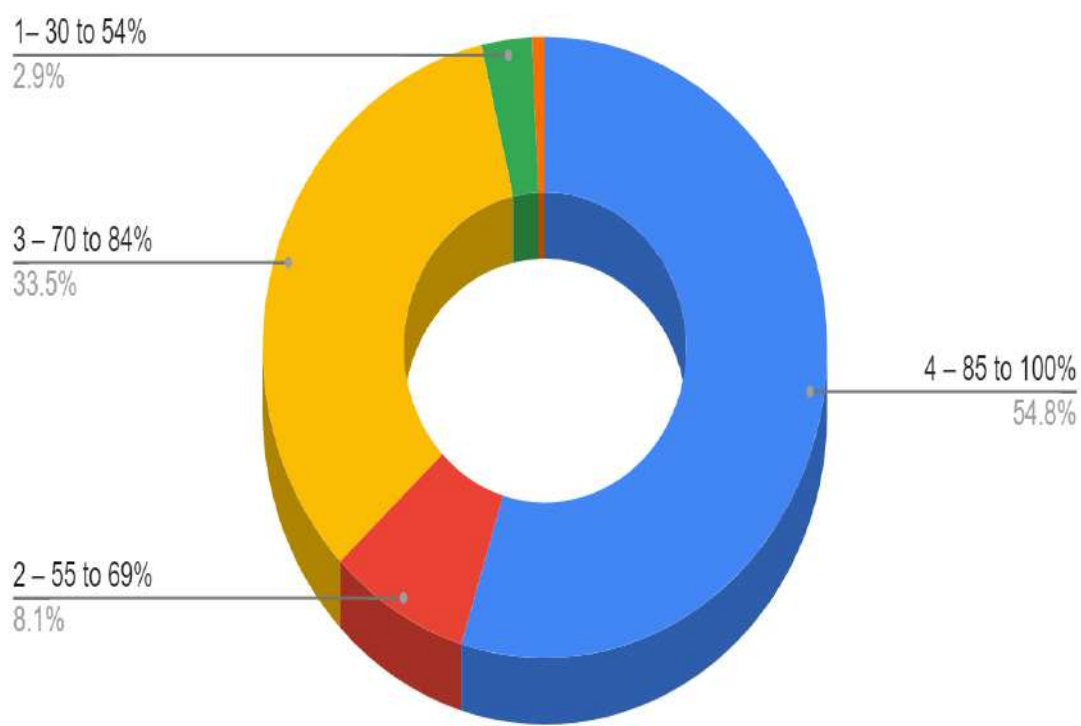

INTRODUCTION

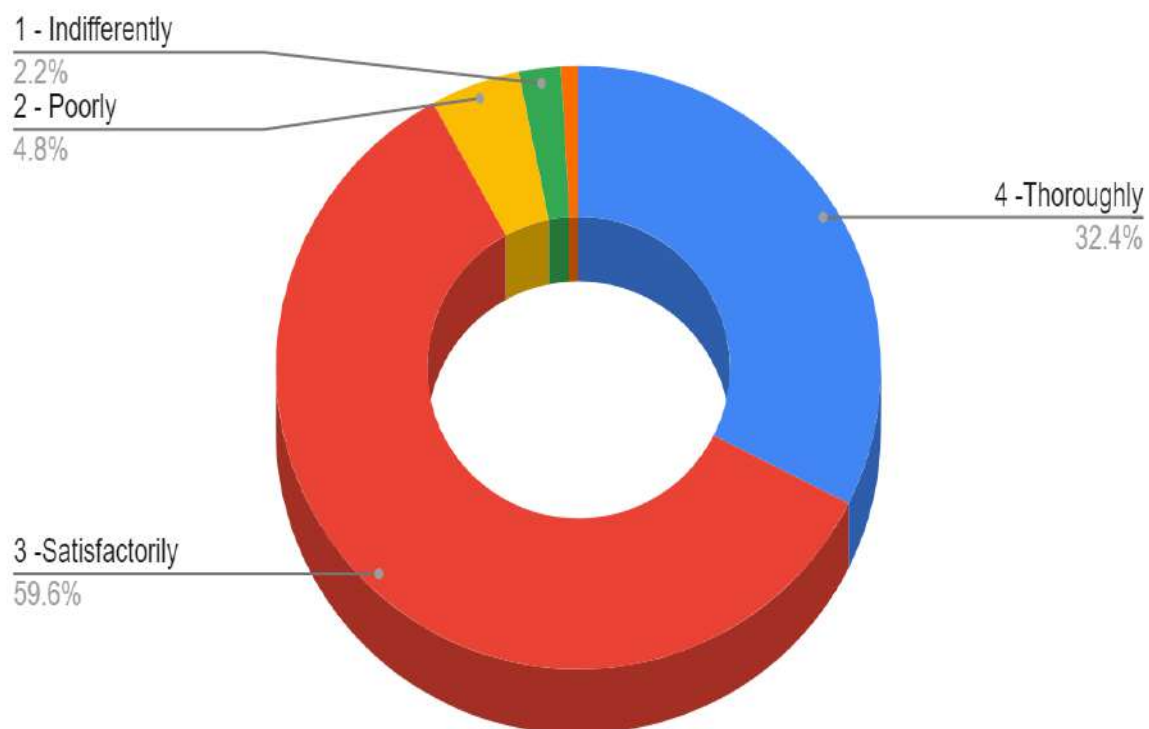

The college considers the inputs from its stakeholders especially from students which are highly required to bring relevant and fruitful results. Their feedback considerably showcases the actual quality of teaching-learning process enabling identification of the strengths of teaching as well as the possible improvements. Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) that results from evaluation of students' experience with the facilities and support they received in the college is very important. It is a valid and reliable tool to understand the key areas for future developments. Thus, it allows understanding the resources for areas that require greater attention. Thus, it is a direct and useful indicator of the effectiveness of teaching-learning in the institution. The college always encourages the students to take active participation in SSS. With this purpose, a Students Satisfaction survey was conducted regarding Teaching–Learning and Evaluation, infrastructure, facilities in college and hostel etc which will help to upgrade the quality of higher education. The college circulated the questionnaire to all admitted students for the session 2023-24 i.e. 3171 students. Out of these, 2017 students i.e. 63.61% of the total strength responded with their feedback and gave their suggestions regarding teaching learning process, infrastructure and other parameters for the college and hostel. 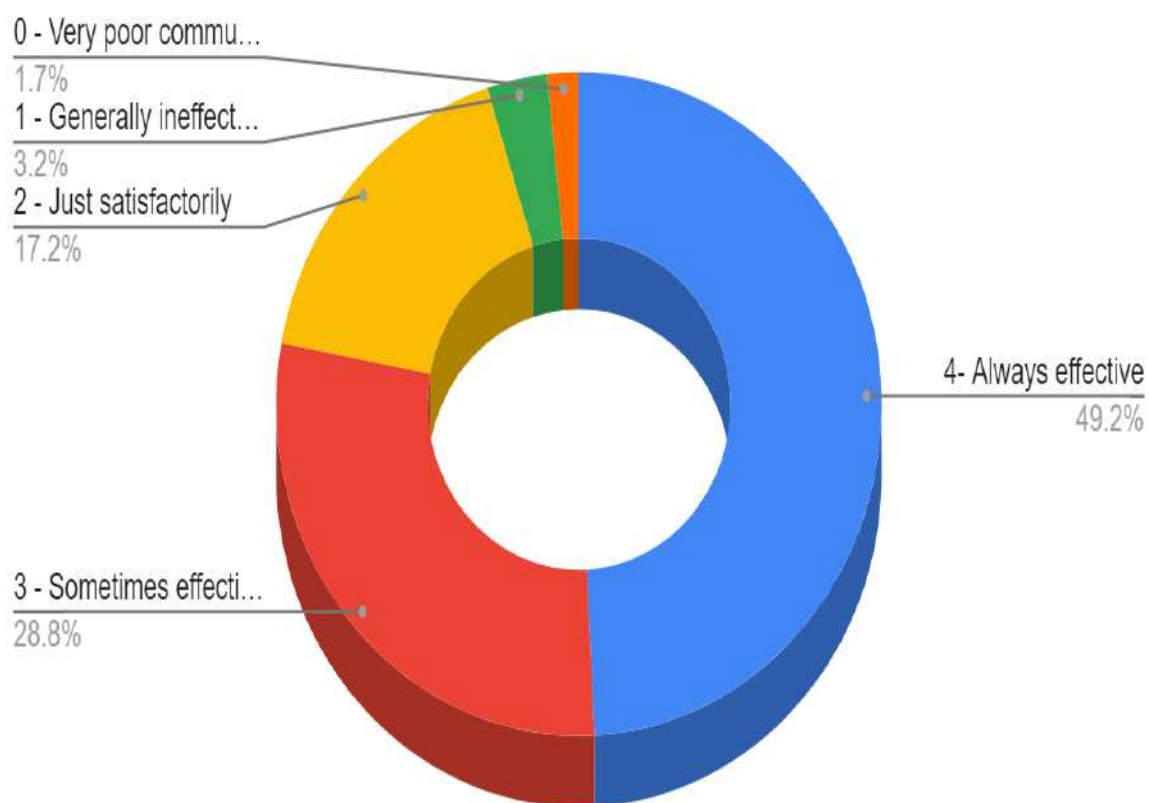

2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?



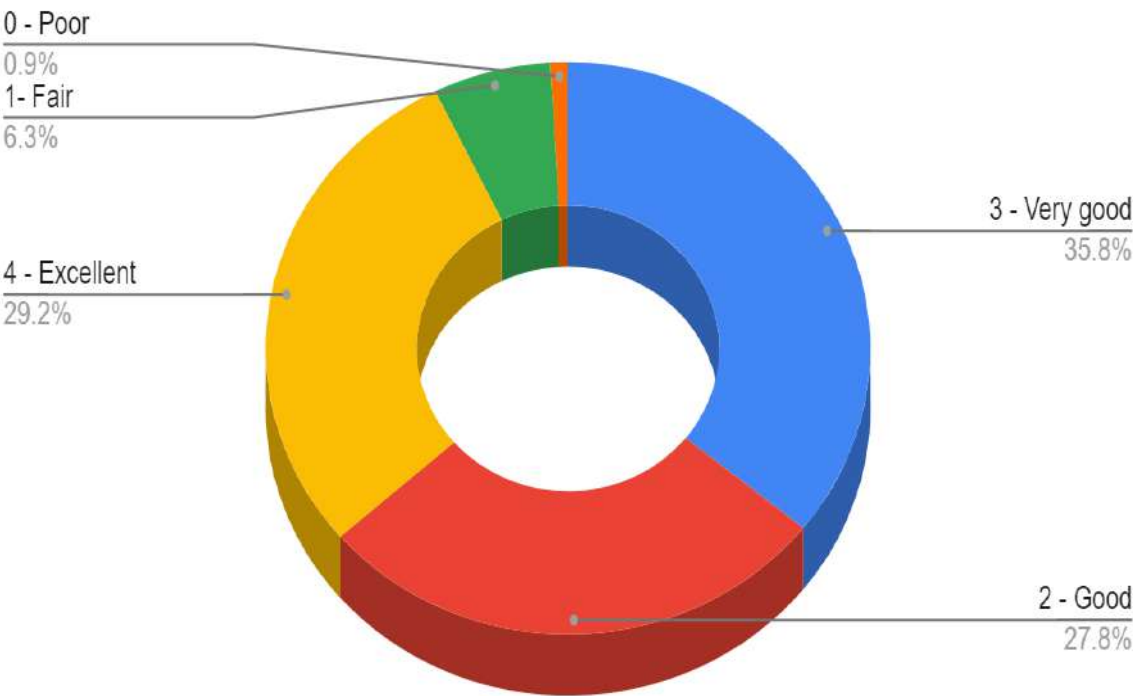

3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?



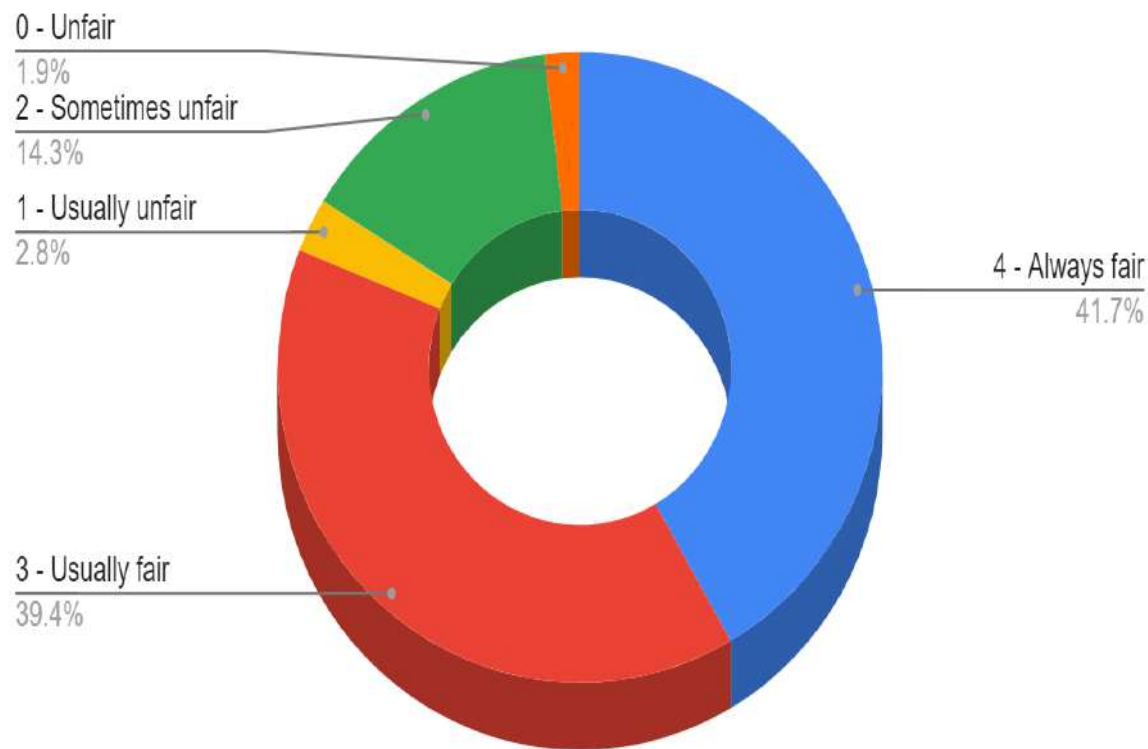

4. The teacher’s approach to teaching can best be described as



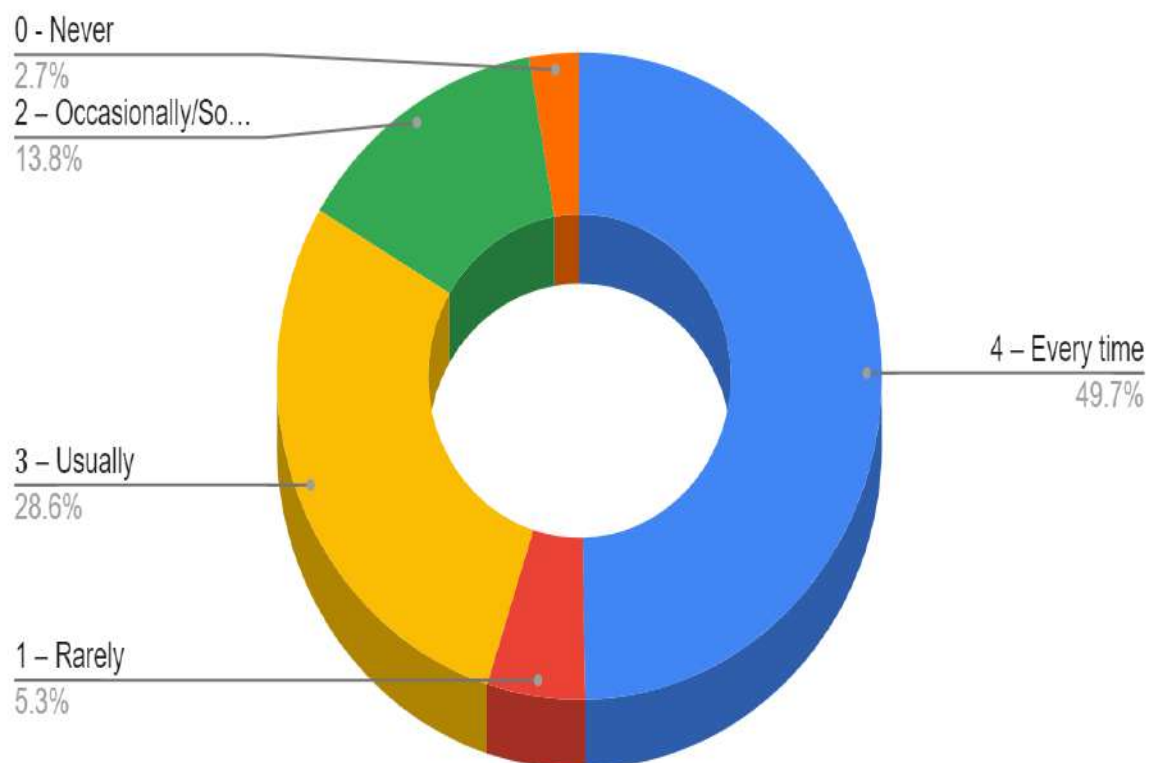

5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.



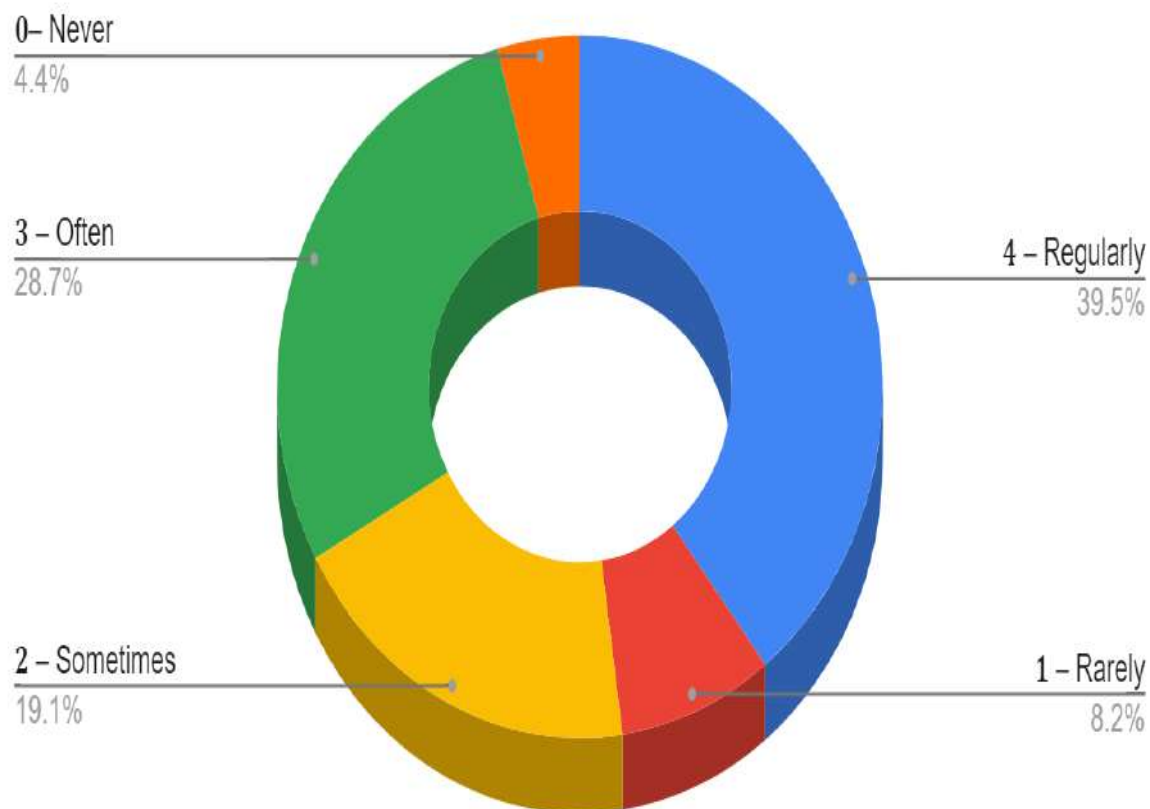

6. Was your performance in assignments/mid semester test discussed with you?



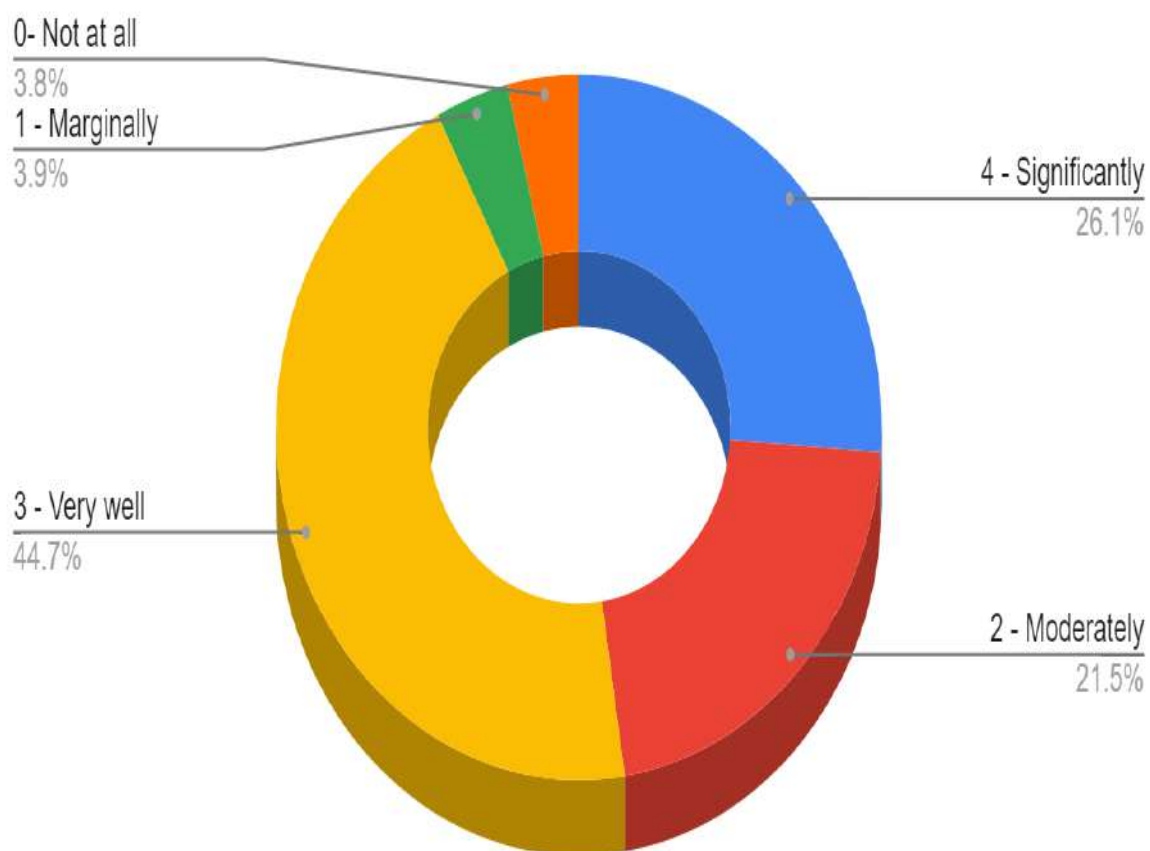

7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange program, and field visit opportunities for students.



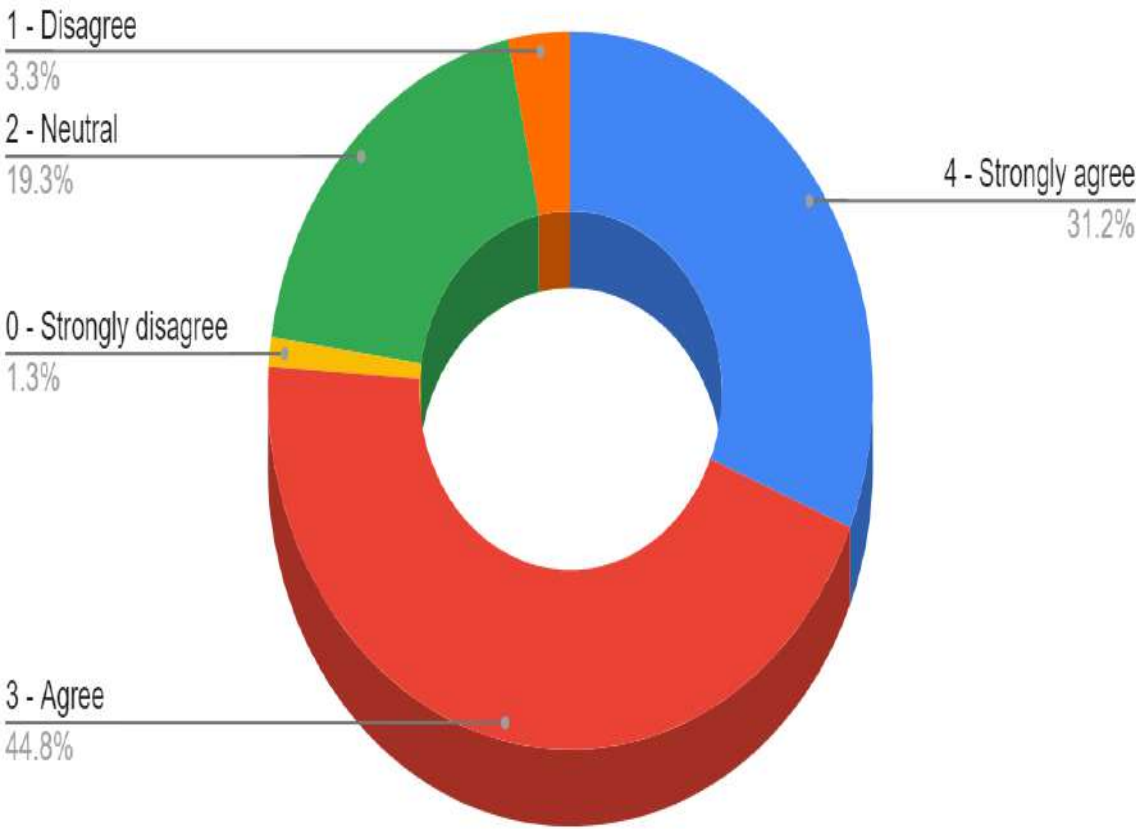

8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institute facilitate you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.



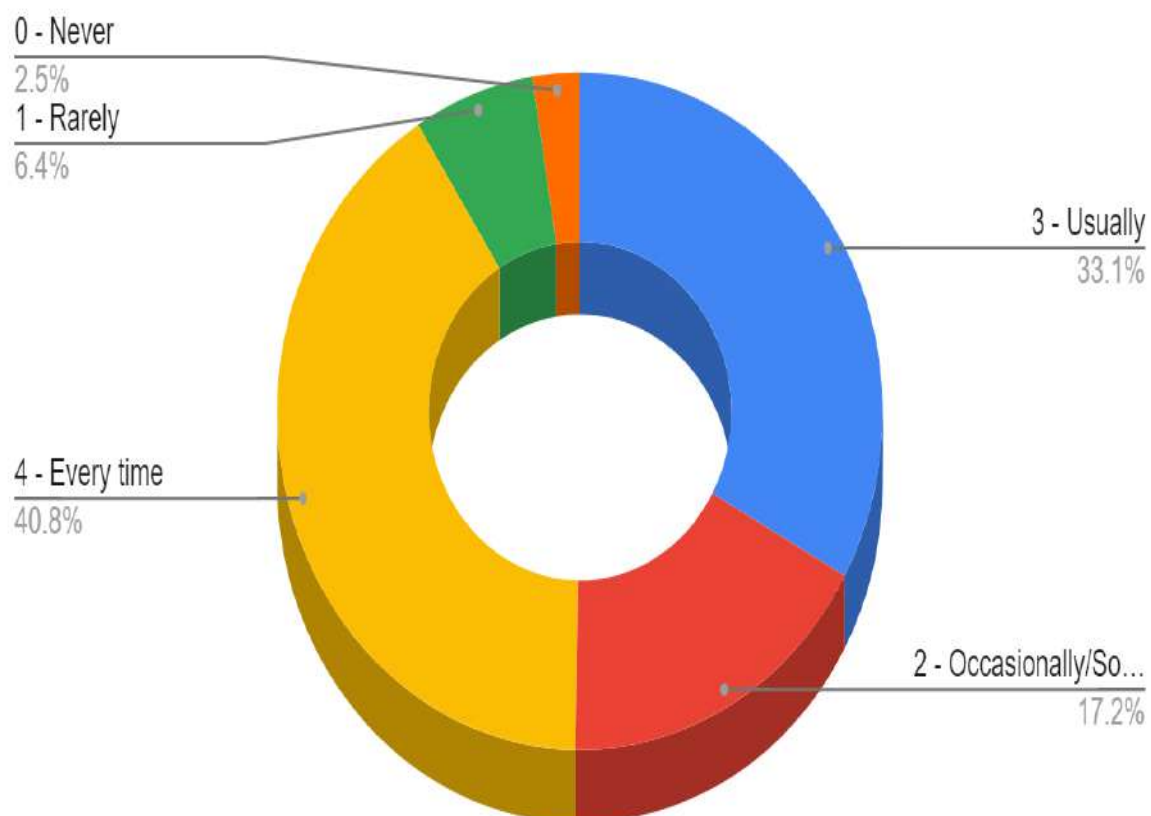

9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.



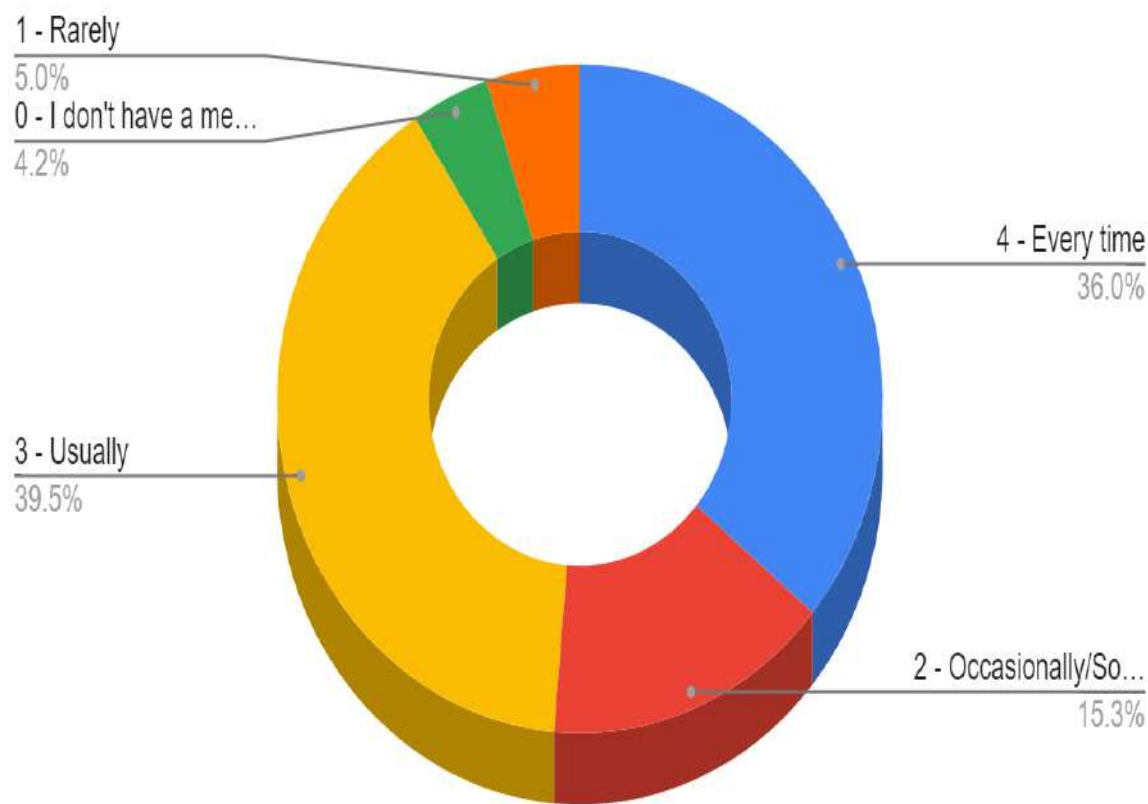

10. Teacher informs you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.



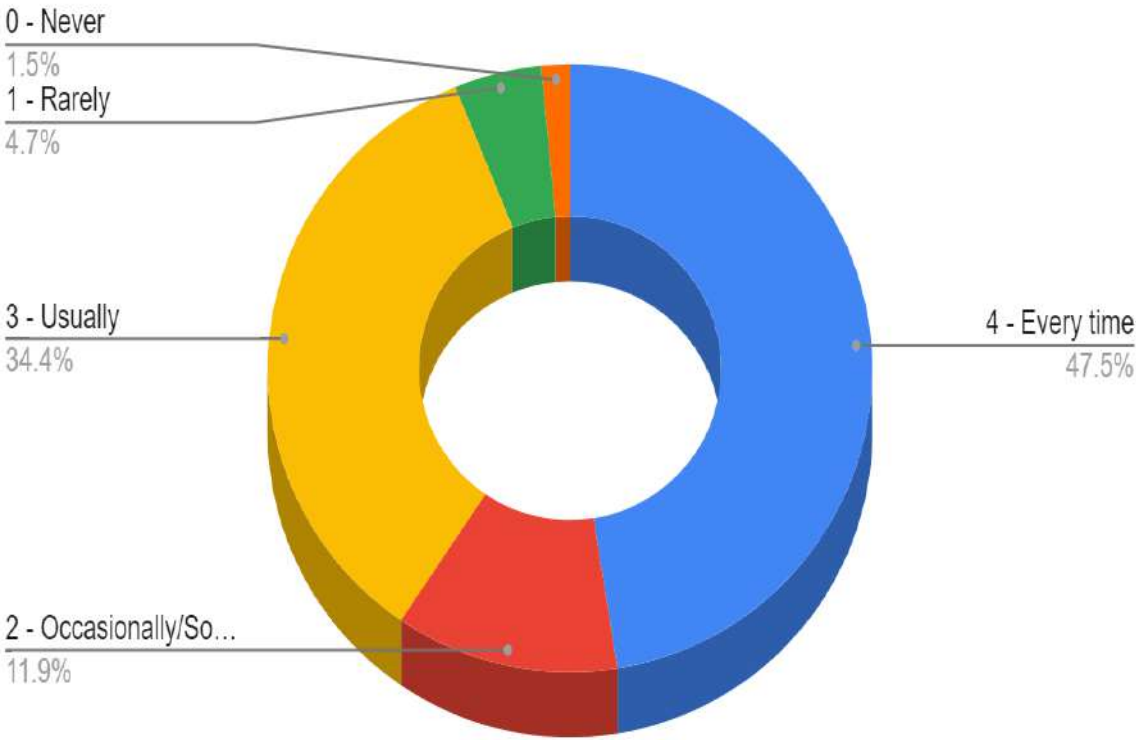

11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up of an assigned task with you.



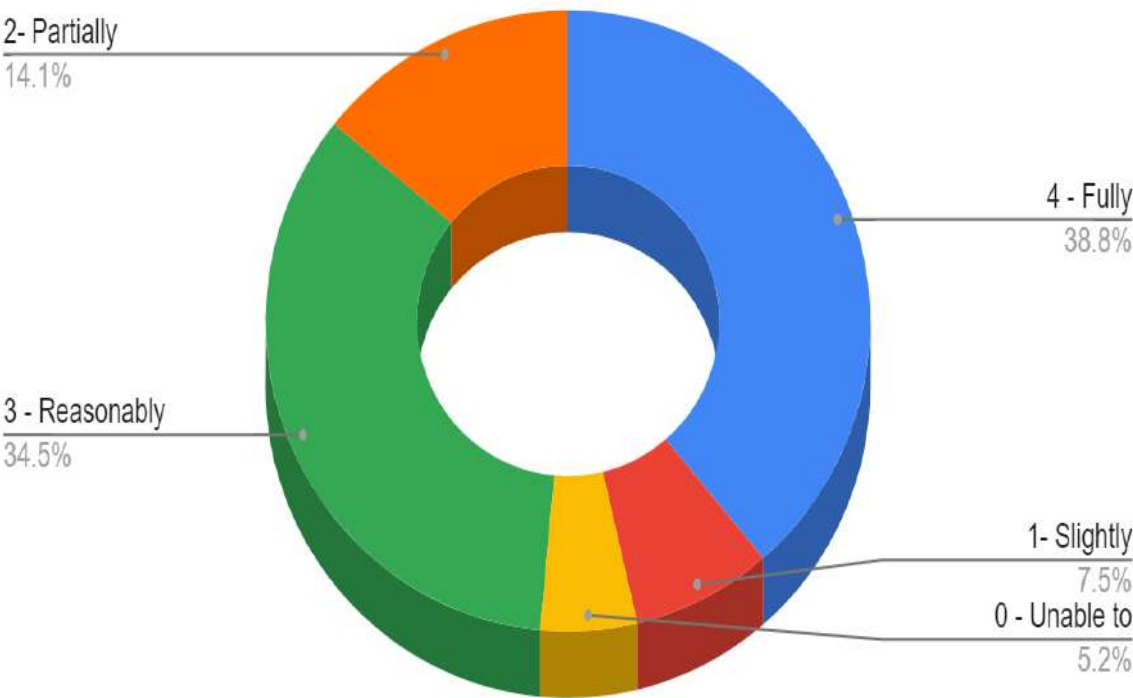

12.The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.



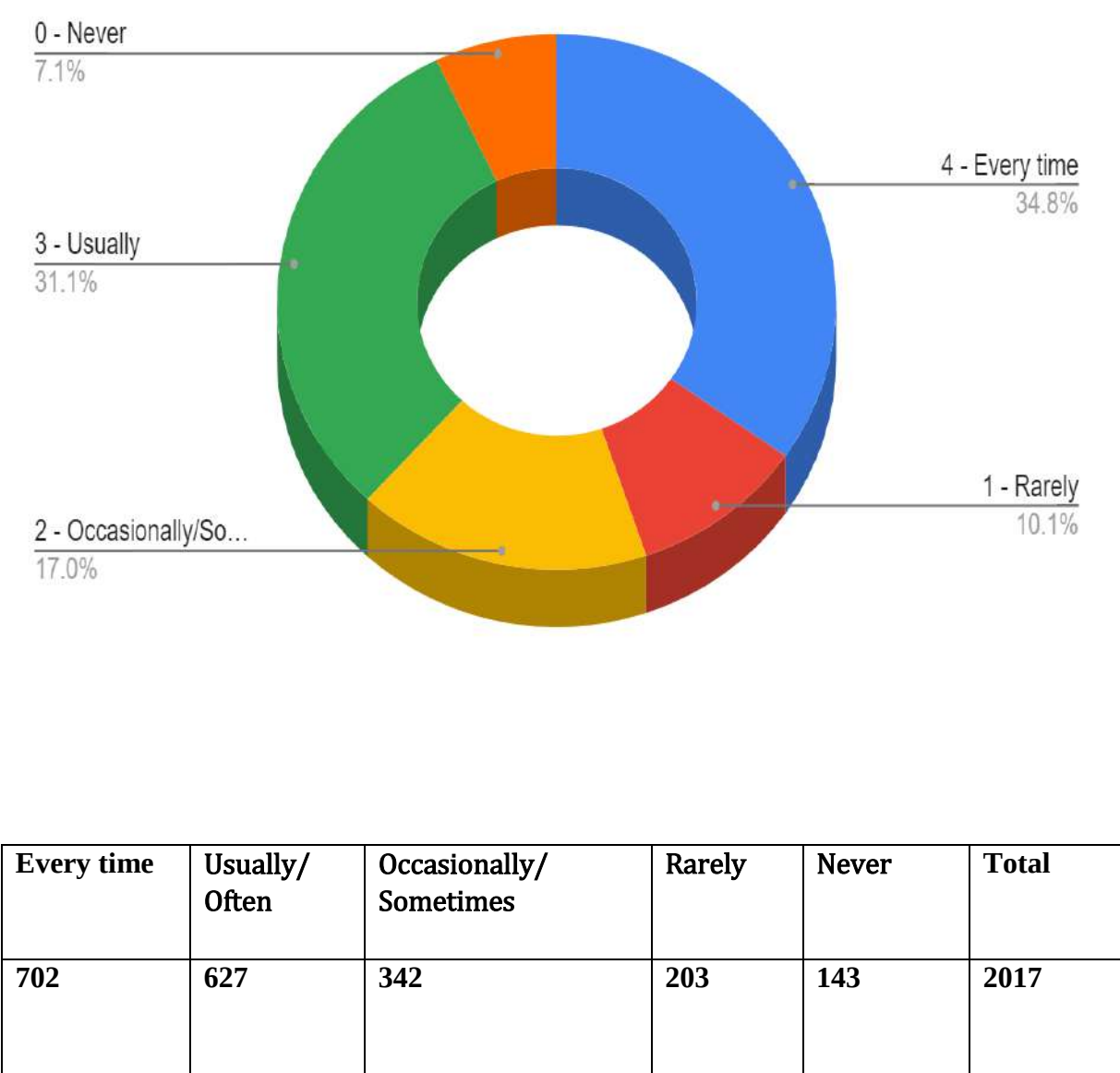

13.The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you by providing right level of challenges.

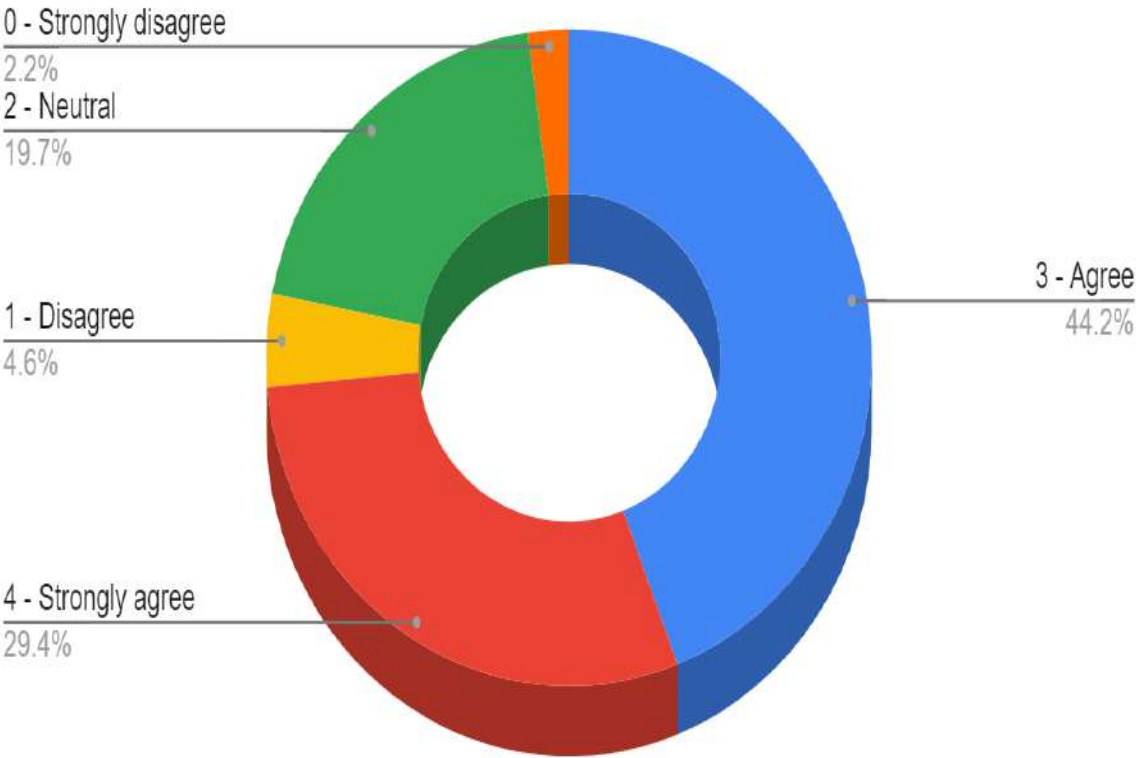

14. Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them.

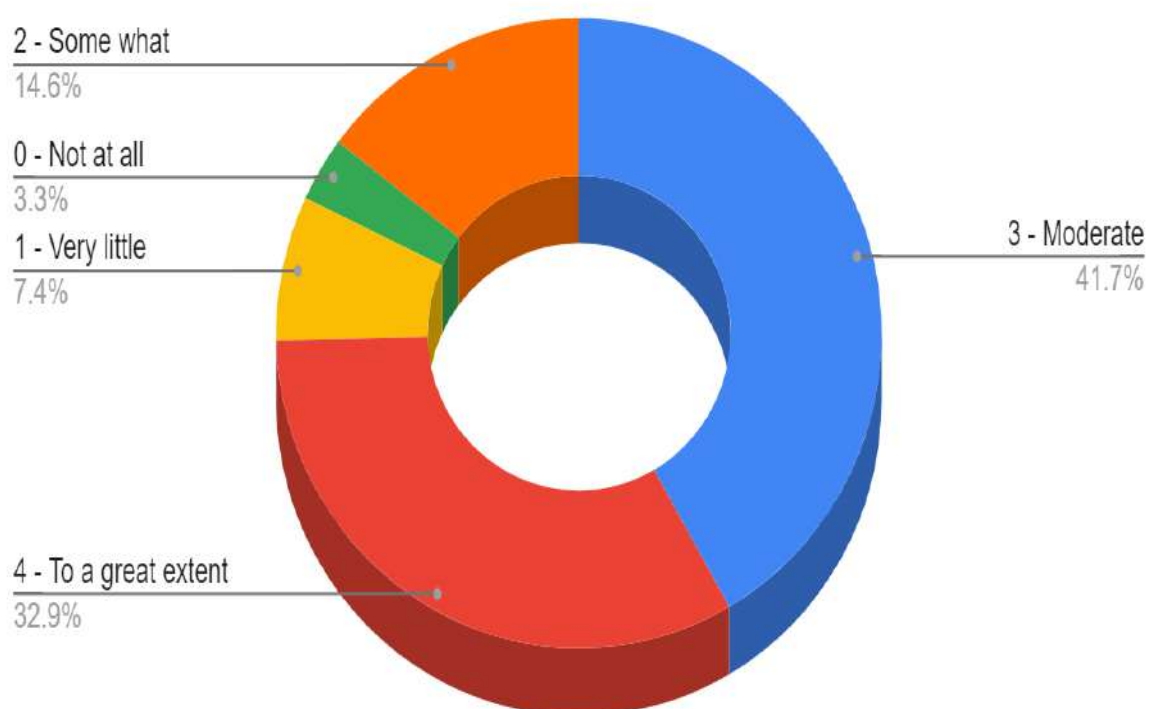


15. The institution makes efforts to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.



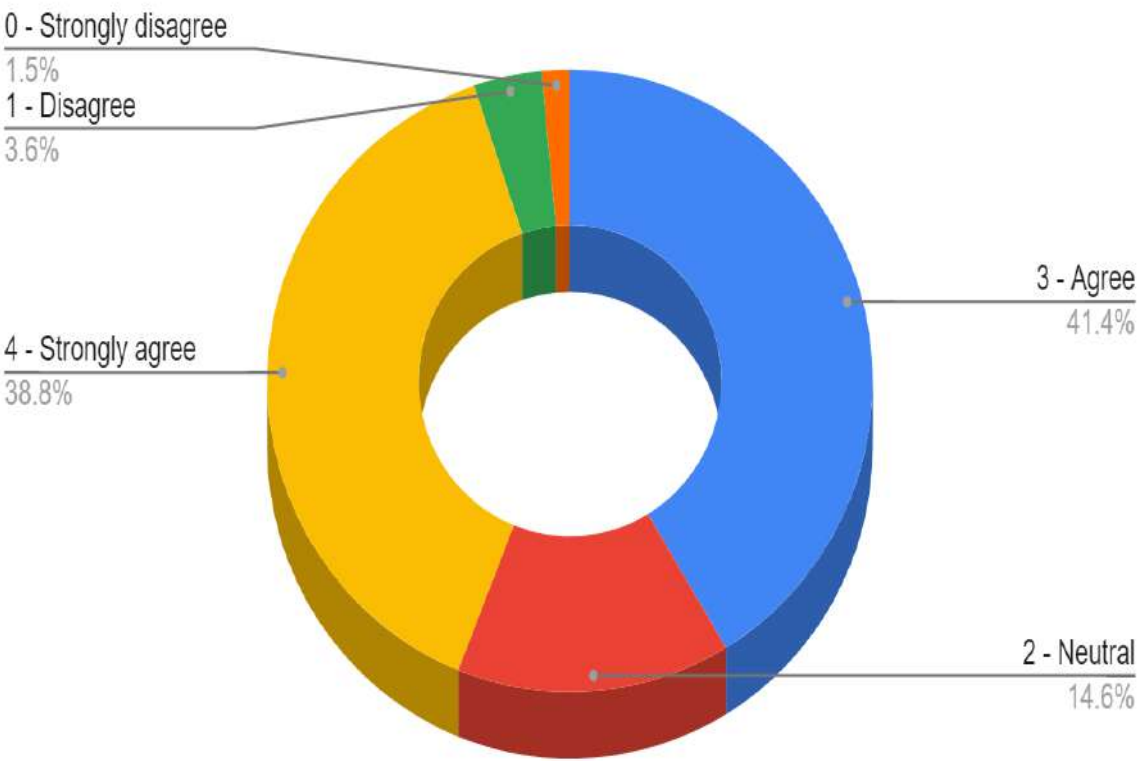

16. The institute/teachers use student centric methods, such as experimental learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.



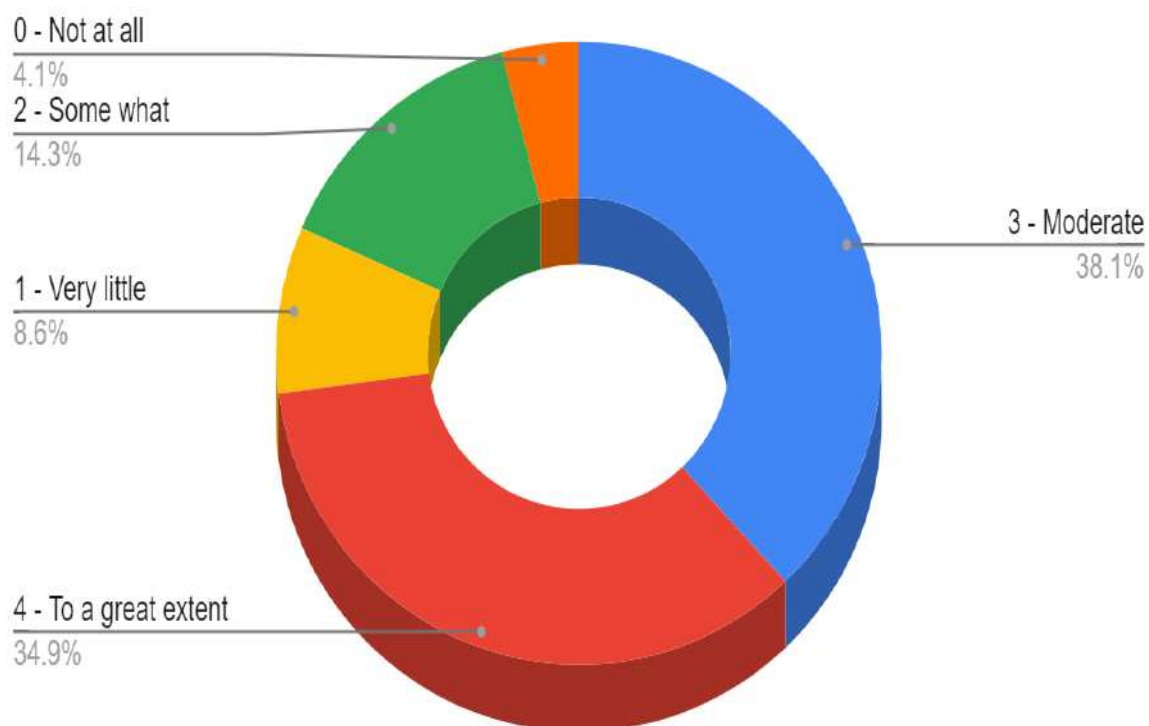

17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities.



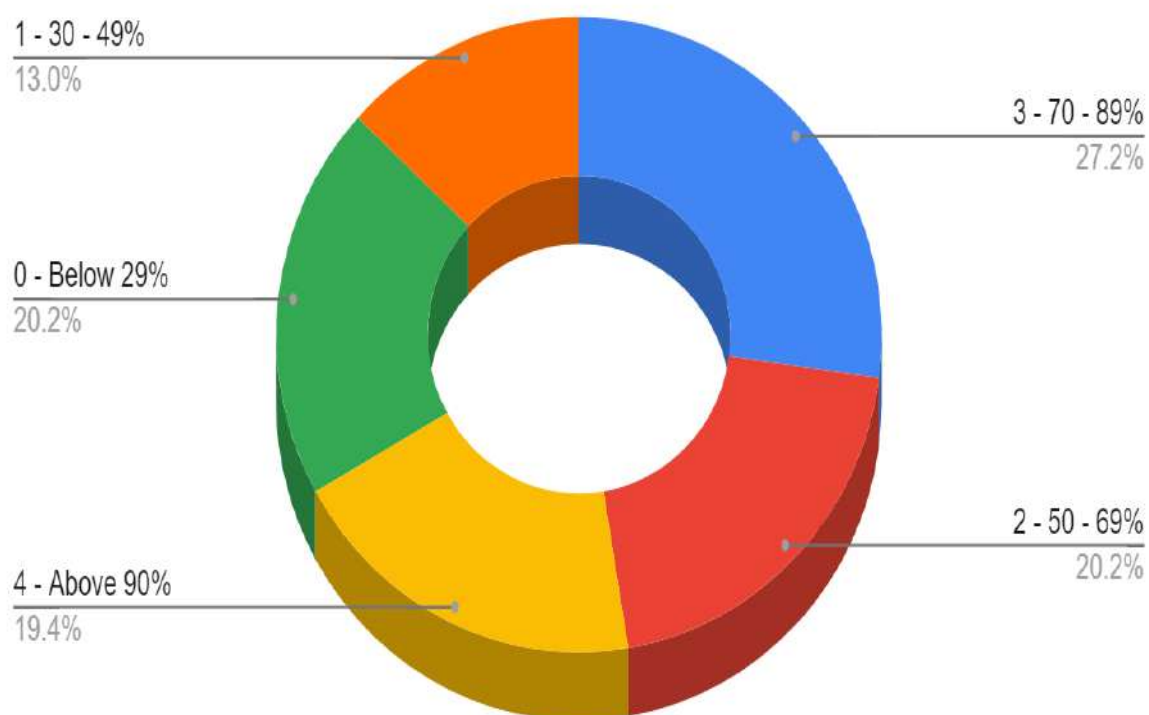

18. Efforts are made by the institute/teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.



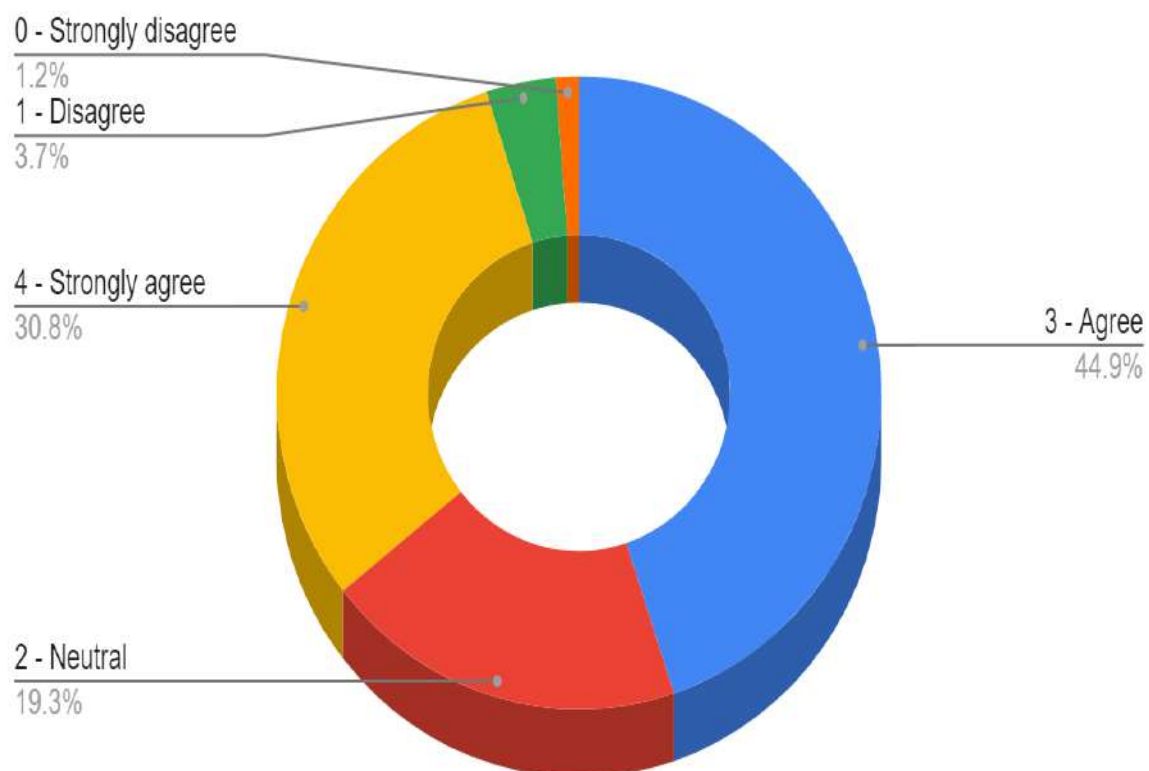

Steps taken on the basis of students' observations regarding teaching – learning

- ❖ Student feedback has revealed a strong desire for more skill-based learning opportunities. To address this, the revised university curriculum, aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP) and modern teaching pedagogies has been framed by the University for the upcoming session which aims to introduce meaningful changes over time, equipping students with the skills needed to take on new and evolving responsibilities.
- ❖ At the college level, the Placement Cell actively organizes workshops, seminars, and training programs to enhance students' employability. While the course curriculum is

designed by Panjab University, faculty members consistently advocate for integrating an industry-focused approach into various courses and programs.

- ❖ Faculty members are encouraged to incorporate ICT tools into their teaching methods to create engaging and interactive learning experiences.
- ❖ To foster student-centered learning, the college regularly hosts guest lectures, workshops, inter-departmental and inter-college festivals and quizzes. Students are encouraged to actively engage in these activities to enrich their learning experience.
- ❖ The library already has books as prescribed by Panjab University in English, Hindi, and Punjabi which are updated regularly by adding new books.
- ❖ The library is fully automated and RFID-enabled.
- ❖ The library staff regularly organizes programs for students.
- ❖ Personal books are allowed in the magazine section, and one notebook is permitted inside the library.
- ❖ Signage in the library has been improved.
- ❖ Students are trained to use the Library OPAC.
- ❖ A proposal has recently been sent for the upgradation of the library.
- ❖ The college library has created and maintains a blog where students can easily access online books, journals, previous years' question papers, and other resources.
- ❖ The internet bandwidth in the college has been increased to 150 Mbps for student use.
- ❖ The college has thirty-nine laboratories across various subjects. These labs are equipped with all relevant items as per university norms. The college also has a dedicated research lab for life sciences.

Steps taken on the basis of students' observations regarding hostel & canteen

- ❖ The college provides two well-furnished hostels offering comfortable accommodations and essential facilities, designed to meet the needs of outstation students.
- ❖ A new hostel building, equipped with a ramp is constructed, and the college plans to renovate the old hostel in the near future. Along with these, provisions for modern facilities such as two lifts, ramps, a reading room, a nurse room, a meditation room, a visitors' room, a sick room, a tuck shop, a cybercafé, an activity room have been planned.

- ❖ For the well-being of students and staff, the college has established a medical room within the campus. Recognizing the demand for a common room, arrangements have been made, and implementation is underway.
- ❖ To maintain cleanliness and ensure the provision of nutritious food in the hostel, the college conducts regular inspections and updates the menu accordingly. Washrooms on all floors have been completely renovated, with sanitary napkin dispensers installed for added convenience.
- ❖ The hostels now offer significantly enhanced Wi-Fi connectivity, providing 24x7 internet access to students.
- ❖ A dedicated welfare committee actively monitors the quality of food, infrastructure upkeep, and resolves any hostel-related concerns promptly.
- ❖ Sanitary napkins are available for purchase from the hostel nurse at a nominal cost of ₹5 per piece. Tata Sky connections have also been installed, with regular recharges ensuring uninterrupted service.
- ❖ All hostel furniture is routinely repaired and maintained to meet the needs of residents. The canteen is cleaned regularly, while the menu quality has been improved based on student feedback. Drinking water coolers are serviced and repaired on a regular basis to ensure functionality.
