## Activity: Exploring Herbarium Techniques- A hand on Field Visit to Botanical Garden and Herbarium/Museum to Panjab University, Chandigarh

Dept. of Botany in association with IIC Cell of the college organised a One day Educational Field Visit for B.Sc. 1st year (SEC) and 2nd year (Botany Students) was organized by Botany Department, PGGCG Sector 42 Chandigarh, to the Botanical Garden and Herbarium/Museum of Botany Department, Panjab University, Chandigarh on 28th October, 2024. Total 45 students were accompanied by 3 teaching staff members: Dr. Harsh Manchanda, Dr. Davinder Kaur and Dr. Radha Chauhan. The students were familiarized with the vegetation. The students were told how to differentiate different plant groups according to their habit (morphology) e.g. thallophyta including algae, fungi and bryophytes; pteridophytes (fern house); gymnosperms (having male and female cones) and angiosperms having special reproductive structure i.e. flowers including Arboretum, Lily pool, Bamboocetum, Cactus House.




Then among Angiosperms different forms were recognized according to their habitat e.g. hydrophytes, mesophytes and xerophytes (specially Cactus House harboring different species of Cactus). Students were also familiarized with many medicinal and spices plants species e.g. Amaltas, Amla, Arjun, Bahera, Elaichi, Harar, Kadamba Tejpatta, etc. Students also learnt lab techniques in Herbarium/Museum like how to prepare herbarium file and how to preserve dried and wet specimens. The specimens of Lemna, Nelumbo, Ephedra, Pteris and Nephrolepis, were also collected for laboratory work materials. The field visit provided students with an interactive learning experience beyond traditional classroom education to cultivate practical skills that are essential for modern scientific research.

## **Activity: IDEATION WORKSHOP**

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#### INTRODUCTION

National Service Scheme, under the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports Govt. of India, popularly known as NSS was launched in Mahatma Gandhi's Birth Centenary Year 1969 with the primary focus on the development of personality of students through community service. "Not Me But You" is the motto of NSS, which tells the importance of democratic living and support the need for self-less service. NSS helps the students develop appreciation to another person's point of view and also define consideration to other living beings. The Philosophy of the NSS is well defined in the motto, which underlines on the belief that the welfare of a person is ultimately dependent on the welfare of the society on the whole. That is the reason why the NSS volunteers shall strive for the welfare of the society. The symbol for the NSS is the giant Rath Wheel of the world famous Konark Sun Temple (The Black Pagoda) in Orissa, India. The wheel defines the cycle of creation, preservation and release and indicate the movement in life over time and space. The symbol hence stands for continuity as well as change and signifies the progressive striving of NSS for social change.

The NSS Wing of the college was established in the year 1982.

## 1. Cleanliness Drive: 9th April, 2023

Cleanliness is not just a habit; it is a reflection of discipline, responsibility, and a commitment to a better society. It emphasizes the direct connection between cleanliness and health, highlighting that a clean environment is essential for a healthy society. Participating in the drive started by the Government of India of "Swatch Bharat Swasth Bharat" a cleanliness drive was carried out by the NSS volunteers in the campus of PGCGC-42, Chandigarh and adjoining New Lake Area, Sector-42, Chandigarh. 

## 7.Rally on "Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao", Interactive Session On "Significance of Menstrual Health and Hygiene" and Distribution of Sanitary Napkins Among the Poor Women of Village Kajheri: 12<sup>th</sup> September, 2023

For gender equity government's initiative of "Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao" was launched in 2015. It focuses on several key objectives like preventing Female Infanticide, promoting gender equality, improving access to education of the female child, enhancing women empowerment, etc. To create awareness among the residents of the Village Kajheri the NSS Wing of PGGCG-42 in collaboration with Open Eyes Foundation NGO on Tuesday i.e 12<sup>th</sup> September, 2023 organized a rally to celebrate "Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao". The event was flagged by the Principal of the college Prof. (Dr.) Nisha Aggarwal. The Chief Guest on the occasion was Nominated Councillor, Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh Dr. Mohinder Kaur. This rally was conducted with lot of enthusiasm to create awareness for gender equity among the residents of the Village Kajheri to promote the Central Govt. Campaign "Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao" (Save the Daughter, Educate the Daughter) so that each and every girl will be benefitted by this central sponsored scheme. The residents were introduced with the theme and beneficial points of the campaign so that the target of this scheme maybe fulfilled which include the addressing of the declining child sex ratio and promoting the education and empowerment of girls in India. We created awareness about gender related issues through rally and interactive session with the women of the area.

Another important aspect related to women which is Menstrual hygiene was emphasized in the talk as it directly impacts the health, well-being, and social participation of women and girls. Proper menstrual hygiene practices, such as using clean and absorbent materials, can help prevent infections like vaginal and urinary tract infections that may arise due to unhygienic practices. Maintaining good hygiene during menstruation can reduce discomfort, odor, and skin irritation, contributing to overall physical well-being. The availability of affordable and accessible menstrual hygiene products enables women and girls to participate in the workforce, pursue education, and engage in various activities without interruption. To promote this aim the NSS Wing therefore held an interactive session on "Significance of Menstrual Hygiene" with the women of the village. Meanwhile, Sanitary Pads were also distributed amongst the women. Besides, an enthusiastic participation of over 80 women, 50 students and Programme Officer Dr. Rachana Rana under the stewardship of NSS Incharge Mr. Mehar Chand was also organized to mark the event. Overall, the rally and the session were very helpful in achieving the aim of spreading Gender equity amongst the females of the village.





## 8. 'Panch Pran' and 'The Amrit Kalaash Yatra': 11th October, 2023

It poses a significant public health threat, especially in tropical and subtropical regions, including parts of Asia, Africa, and South America. With no specific antiviral treatment available, dengue continues to challenge healthcare systems worldwide. Awareness, prevention, and timely intervention are key to managing this life-threatening disease. NSS Incharge Mr. Mehar Chand alongwith Dr. Rashmi Kohli and Mr. Vikas (Bioinfo) accompanied with Health Dept. Officials, Chd. Administration went to Village Kajheri on 12<sup>th</sup> Oct, 23 to check coolers, OHT, fridge trays, containers, etc. in around 155 houses and gave notices to 2 for stagnant water and breeding of larvae of Aedes ageypti in Village Kajheri. They were accompanied by 35 students.







## 10. Donation Collection For Flood Victims of Himachal Pradesh And Sikkim: 17<sup>th</sup> Oct, 2023

In a remarkable effort to make a positive contribution to the health and well-being of the community, the NSS unit and Health Society of PGGCG-42, Chandigarh in collaboration with Shree Shiv Kanwar Mahasangh Charitable Trust, Open Eyes Foundation and Govt. Multi Speciality Hospital, Sector 16, Chandigarh organized blood donation camp on 16<sup>th</sup> November 2023 to mark the martyrdom of Shaheed Bhagat Singh, Sukhdev & Rajguru. # 17. Health Check up Camp on Women's Health: 9th February, 2024

Women play a vital role in shaping families, communities, and society. Yet, their health often takes a backseat due to societal expectations, multitasking roles, and lack of awareness. Regular health check-ups for women are essential to detect, prevent, and manage health issues at an early stage, ensuring their well-being and longevity. Prioritizing women's health is not only beneficial for them individually but also has a ripple effect on the well-being of families and society as a whole. Women often neglect their health due to busy schedules or cultural norms, making regular check-ups even more critical. Regular screenings also empower women with knowledge about their health, enabling them to make informed decisions about their lifestyles, diets, and medical care. A proactive approach to health not only improves quality of life but also reduces the financial burden of treating advanced-stage illnesses. A health check up camp was organized in our campus to spread the awareness about self health and also make diagnosis easily available for the students and the staff members. Over 150 students participated in this drive and availed the opportunity. Also many female staff members got their mammography test done by team from GMCH-32, Chd.







#### 18. Pulse Polio Training: 23rd February, 2024

Pulse Polio is one of the most significant public health initiatives aimed at eradicating poliomyelitis (polio) from the world. This life-threatening disease, caused by the poliovirus, primarily affects children under the age of five, leading to paralysis, disability, and sometimes death. The Pulse Polio campaign was launched in India in 1995 as part of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI). Its mission is to vaccinate every child under the age of five with oral polio vaccine (OPV) to stop the transmission of the poliovirus. The success of this campaign has transformed India's fight against polio, making it polio-free since 2014. The term "Pulse Polio" refers to the nationwide immunization program where oral polio drops are administered to children on designated days, known as National Immunization Days (NIDs). The aim is to vaccinate every child, ensuring no child is left vulnerable to polio. This strategy, called "pulse vaccination," works by breaking the chain of transmission of the poliovirus in the community. NSS wing organized a Pulse Polio Training in Multimedia room of the college by a team of doctors of Health Dept, U.T. Chandigarh, which was attended by over 250 students and programme officers. It gave a hands on training to the students.







## 19. Voter's Awareness Rally: 2<sup>nd</sup> March, 2024

Democracy thrives when citizens actively participate in the electoral process. Voting is not just a right but also a responsibility that empowers people to shape the future of their nation. However, voter turnout often remains low due to a lack of awareness, misinformation, or apathy. #### 20. International Women Day: 7th March, 2024

This day serves as both a celebration and a call to action for advancing women's rights worldwide. The first National Women's Day was observed in the United States in 1909, inspired by the women's labor movement. In 1977, the United Nations officially recognized March 8th as International Women's Day, emphasizing the global importance of gender equality and women's empowerment. Each year, International Women's Day is celebrated with a specific theme, focusing on a critical aspect of women's rights. Themes such as "Choose to Challenge," "DigitALL: Innovation and Technology for Gender Equality," and "Break the Bias" highlight the multifaceted challenges women face while encouraging collective action for change. To commemorate this day NSS wing invited Dr. Rewa Rishi to sensitize young girls on various issues related to women empowerment. This talk was attended by over 150 students.







#### 21. Awareness Rally on "Beti Bachao Beti Padha": 9th March, 2024

"Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao" (Save the Daughter, Educate the Daughter) is one of India's most significant social campaigns launched by the Government of India in 2015. This initiative aims to address critical issues such as the declining child sex ratio, gender inequality, and the need to empower girls through education. The program seeks to promote the value of the girl child and ensure her survival, protection, and education in a society that has long struggled with patriarchal norms and gender biases. India has witnessed alarming trends in the declining child sex ratio (number of girls per 1,000 boys) over the decades. Practices like **female feticide, infanticide**, and societal preference for male children have contributed significantly to this imbalance. This skewed ratio not only reflects discrimination against girls but also has long-term social and demographic consequences. Highlighting this problem Prof. (Dr.) Sudhir Sharma participated in this talk with over 150 students participation.

# 22. Interactive Session on Child Sexual Abuse Prevention: 11th March, 2024

Preventing child sexual abuse (CSA) is a critical issue that requires awareness, education, and proactive measures. To teach children about body autonomy and the concept of "safe" and "unsafe" touch. We have to help them understand that their body belongs to them. We have to foster an environment where children feel safe discussing their concerns without fear of punishment or disbelief. By conducting workshops for parents, teachers, and caregivers to recognize signs of abuse and how to intervene. Over 100 students attended a very interesting interactive session by Mr. Rahul, Founder of NGO Bachpan: Save the Innocence which addressed a sensitive topic of Child Sexual Abuse Prevention.



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
