
Feedback from Students:

Relevance of Curriculum








An overwhelming section of the respondent students believe that the curricular aspects such as personality development, soft skills, life skills, etc has had a positive impact on their employability.




Almost all the students agreed that teachers educated them about the course outlines, requirements, expected outcomes and what the students had to do in order to achieve the expected competencies.


Feedback from Teachers:






A large number of faculty members found that the objectives of the curriculum are well defined and believe that not only does it enhance the skills of the students but that it will also help them in getting jobs.

Infrastructural facilities, necessary for teaching and learning are adequately available






The above pie chart shows that most of the respondents agree that there is requisite freedom to adopt new techniques in teaching practices.

The University provides adequate funding and support to faculty members for upgrading their skills and qualifications





1.)Perception about the Academic Standards



2.) Perception about the Infrastructure:



3.) Perception about the Extra-Curricular activities






Accessibility to College Administration

CCTV cameras are installed at the strategic points on the campus. There is round the clock vigil by the security guards be it at the gate, around the academic blocks, or at the college hostels. An Anti-Ragging committee and a drug de-addiction society have been constituted to prevent these occurrences.
