Post Graduate Government College for Girls, Sector 42, a premier multi-faculty institution of Higher Education in the City Beautiful, Chandigarh, was established in 1982. Spread over a spacious campus of nearly 18 acres in the southern part of Chandigarh, the college has emerged as an all-encompassing institute. - Mr. Anurag Singh Thakur is the Former Minister for Information & Broadcasting and Youth Affairs & Sports, Government of India. Presently he is a five-time elected Member of the Indian Parliament (Lok Sabha) from Hamirpur, Himachal Pradesh. Previously, he served as a Minister of State for Finance and Corporate Affairs in 2019.
- In his capacity as a minister, he has spearheaded numerous pioneering initiatives aimed at advancing both the news and entertainment sectors, while also notably enhancing the nation's medal count.
- In 2016, he was commissioned as a regular officer in the Territorial Army at the rank of Lieutenant of the 124 Sikh Regiment, thereby becoming the first sitting BJP Member of Parliament to join as a regular officer. In 2021, he was promoted to the rank of Captain.
- Within Parliament, he currently serves as Chairman of Parliamentary Standing Committee on Coal, Mines and Steel and in the past has been the Chairman of Parliamentary Standing Committee on IT and Member of Public Accounts Committee.
- He was a part of the Indian Parliamentary Delegation, at the 149<sup>th</sup> Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) Assembly in Geneva, where he represented India on UN Affairs.
- He also represented India at the Parliamentary Committee on WTO and the Steering Committee.
- During the 16th Lok Sabha, he was appointed as the Chief Whip, Lok Sabha, becoming the youngest to assume the post.
- He is the former National President of Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha (BJYM- Youth Wing of the Bharatiya Janata Party) and has been the only National President to be appointed for three consecutive terms in the BJP.
- Sh. Thakur is an avid sports lover and has contributed immensely to sports in the capacity of a sports administrator. He has served as the President of the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI), President Himachal Pradesh Cricket Association (HPCA).
- Earlier, he was awarded the Sansad Ratna Award; conferred with Champions of Change 2019 Award; recognized as a "Young Global Leader" by the World Economic Forum and Global Fund made Shri Thakur their "Global Champion" in the category of Public Health.

## **NSS**





## WOMEN CELL AND GENDER EQUITY SOCIETY

### *An Emotional Space for Young Women*

The Women Cell began with a distinctive purpose of providing an emotional and personal space for students of the college. Women's Cell has become a significant part of the institution and plays a vital role in the empowerment of young girl students. Our college runs a Women Cell and offers a space for 'personal and the private'.

**EQ – Emotional Quotient** is the mainstay of this initiative, Women Cell offers a space for young girls to share their personal anxieties and find solutions through counselling or any help they require in any situation.

Women Cell works at the principle of anonymity and the commitment of being non-judgmental or biased, to hear and gently suggest but empower young women to make their own decisions and negotiations.

Girls remain the most vulnerable - both within and outside the home. The complex issues that confront them often need serious consideration and concrete action. Young adolescent girls go through numerous growing-up predicaments. They face varied personal, inter-personal dilemmas: strained parent-child relationships, peer pressures, social media influences which bring confusion, complexes, and feeling of inferiority in their perception and relationships. These complex issues that confront them need serious consideration and concrete action.

**Women's cell** offers a space for young girls to freely express their anxieties and find solutions through counselling or any help required in specific situations.

Frequently caught in difficult situations they may need help in some form or the other. Encouraging group activities, sharing of inter-subjective realities in their collective journey contribute to building emotional bonds and becoming each other's emotional strength.

Developing a sense of empowerment through innovative processes and activities, young girls are encouraged to discern the underlying dimensions of discriminatory practices and learn to negotiate and make informed choices thus honing their potential to become spirited participants in society thereby enabling them to be the agents of change.

### VISION AND MISSION OF WOMEN CELL

This is an awareness and capacity building program, initiated especially for the young students of the college, with an endeavour to promote a holistic growth.

The idea then is to be: '**KNOWING OURSELVES** and **BUILDING OURSELVES**'.
