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Post Graduate Government College for Girls, Sector 42, a premium multi-faculty institution of higher education in the City Beautiful, Chandigarh, was established in 1982. Spread over a spacious campus of nearly 18 acres in the southern part of Chandigarh, the college has emerged as an all-encompassing institute. It imparts education to around 3000 students in the streams of Commerce, Humanities, Science and Computer Applications. A bouquet of multiple courses offered by the college comprise of Doctorate Course in Zoology, Master's Degree Courses, PG Diploma in Computer Applications and Graduate Degree Courses. With the implementation of National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, Bachelor's Degree Courses now have multifarious subject combinations, along with options from baskets of Ability Enhancement Courses, Discipline Specific Courses, Multi-Disciplinary Courses, Skill Enhancement Courses and Value Added Courses.

As many as 204 subject combinations in Arts and 21 in Sciences can be opted by a student. Our College has also become the first city Government College to be approved as a Research Centre in the Subject of Zoology by Panjab University, Chandigarh.

A team of 99 dedicated and highly qualified faculty members facilitate effectual teaching and contribute in shaping the GenNext. The college has 05 Professors, 29 Associate Professors and 65 Assistant Professors which include 65 Ph.D. and 13 M.Phil. degree holders. With the emphasis on consistent enhancement of skills and research, in 2025-2026 the faculty has published 13 research papers, 37 books (with ISBN) and edited Chapters. Faculty members of different departments have completed projects sponsored by various agencies. Currently, 01 major consultancy project is ongoing and 38 research scholars are pursuing doctoral research with the esteemed faculty while 24 scholars have already completed their doctorates. In addition to this, support staff of around 100 members help in the efficient running of the college.

Many of the faculty members are members of the Board of Studies, added members of different faculties of Panjab University, Chandigarh, member of Academic Council, Vice President of Chandigarh Sangeet Natak Academy and also actively involved in framing curriculum and creating learning resources for other government institutes/universities.

UNDERGRADUATE INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME

(UNDER NEP 2020)

In alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the University Grants Commission (UGC) Guidelines, Panjab University has fully integrated structured internships into its undergraduate curriculum. Designed for students pursuing 3-year UG degrees, 4-year UG Honours degrees, and 4-year Honours with Research programs, these internships offer essential experiential learning. They empower students to transition seamlessly from academic classrooms to dynamic, real-world professional environments.

Internship Categories

The university offers two distinct internship pathways for students of 5th Semester.

1. Internship for Enhancing Employability (IEE):

The IEE bridges the gap between academic theory and industry demands. It helps students cultivate professional behavior, teamwork, ethical workplace values, and critical problem-solving skills while gaining exposure to corporate frameworks, start-ups, or local government bodies.

2. Internship for Developing Research Aptitude (IDRA):

The IDRA nurtures foundational scientific capabilities. Interns actively engage in identifying research problems, working with advanced methodologies, interpreting quantitative or qualitative data, utilizing professional research tools, writing scientific reports and understanding intellectual property rights.

Academic Credit and Structure

Internship engagements carry 2 to 4 academic credits, and a mandatory commitment of 60 to 120 hours spread consistently across the semester. For students planning an early exit after their first or second year of study, completing a 4-credit, 120-hour internship, as mentioned in their course curriculum, is compulsory in addition to the standard course requirements to secure their exit certifications.

Understanding the System

An Internship Coordinator at the institutional level actively handles student registrations, and identifies suitable organisations, industries, research institutions, NGOs and other relevant entities for internships.

UNDERGRADUATE INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME

(UNDER NEP 2020)

Every intern is paired with an internal Internship Supervisor who guides and evaluates her progress. Additionally, students work under a mentor at the Organisation of Internship who delivers hands-on technical training, provides professional feedback, and endorses the final report.

Internship opportunities are identified collectively by Nodal Officers and Supervisors via recognized online portals and institutional networks. Students may also independently propose external internships which are subject to official approval prior to commencement.

Evaluation and Rigor

Fulfillment of all documentation and hour requirements is mandatory to secure academic credits. 80% weightage is assigned to the comprehensive Internship/Research Report and a Viva Voce before a two-member internal committee. The remaining 20% weightage is determined by the Supervisor's evaluation of the student's daily/weekly activity logbooks, punctuality, and professionalism.

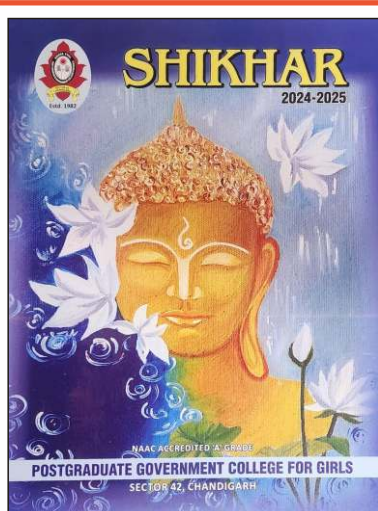

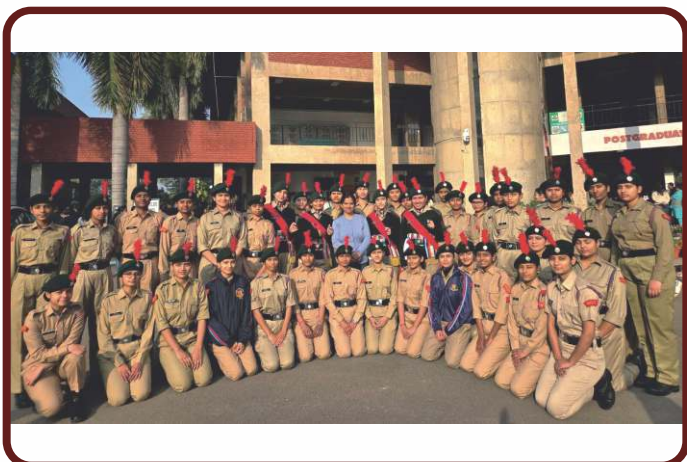

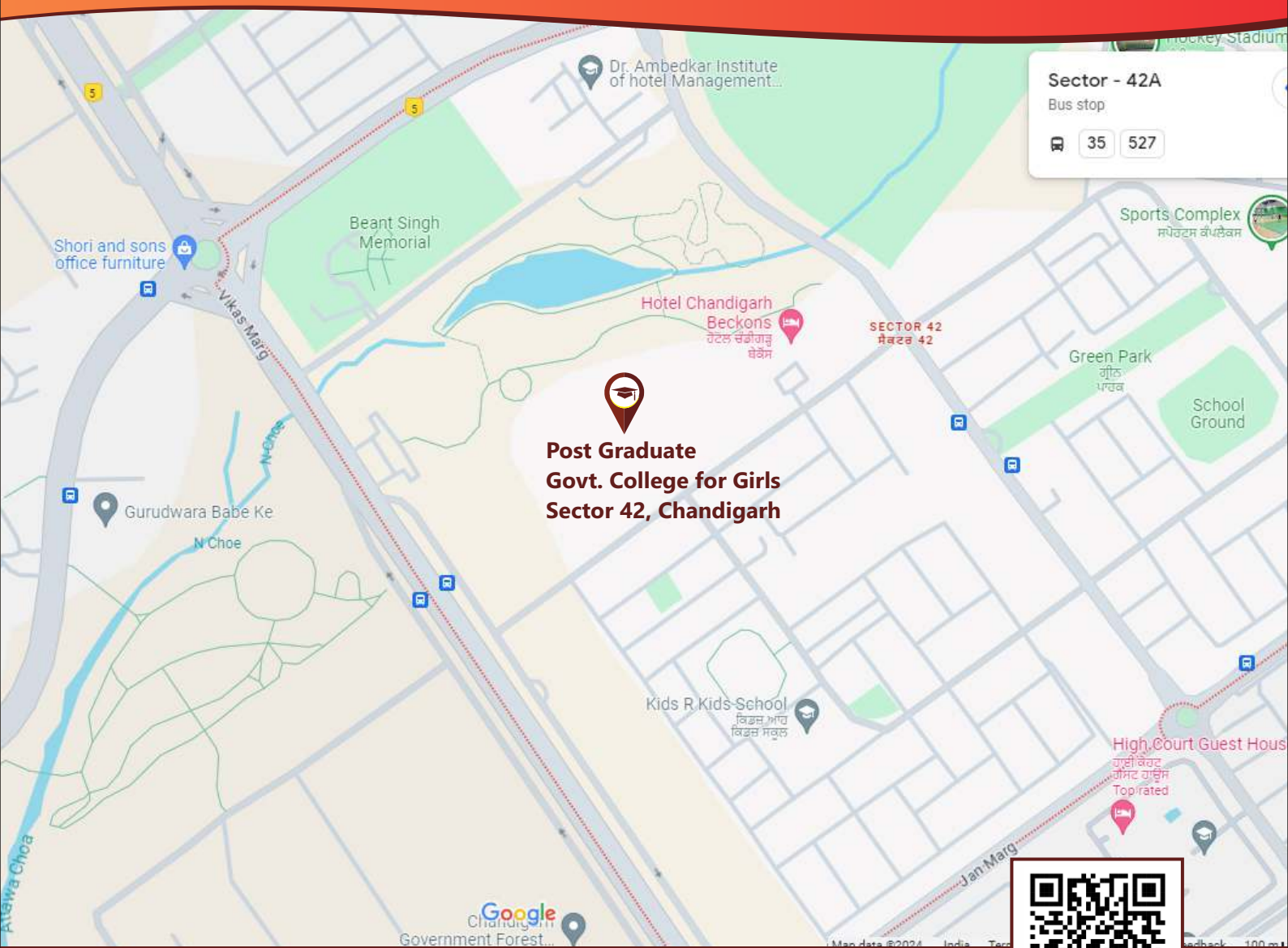
